

**Vaughan Council**

The Municipal Council of the Township of Vaughan met in the Town Hall on Friday, the 10th day of December, at 10 o'clock a. m. The reeve in the chair. Members present: Messrs. Bryson, Kirby, Boyle and Watson.

The minutes of last meeting were read and on motion approved. The following petitions were then presented:

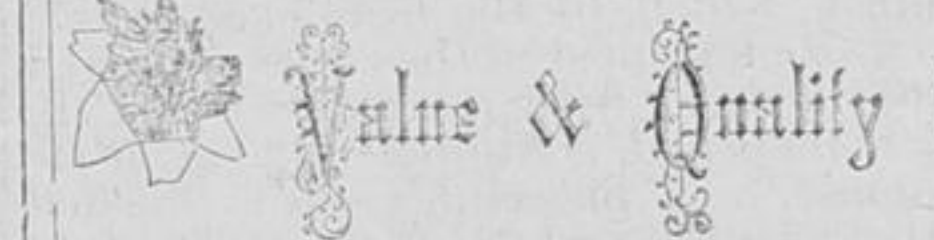
