Mr. Smith-It was no use. We were out voted three to two. I was not in favor of raising the rate at all. Deputy-Reeve Stiver-I think we were justified under the unusual circumstances to increase the rate this year. Why Whitchurch raised theirs to a ten mill rate.

Mr. Smith — How about Scarboro? Mr. Stiver-We were up against it this year.

Mr. Padget-Well couldn't you see it coming. I foresaw this difficulty and that was why I favored the issuing of debentures which could have been done without any necessity for a rate increase.

Reeve Gohn-Well there was never a resolution presented about deben-
