Think Summer!

Italian Immersion Programme Planned



Students from St. Jerome's College will have the opportunity of plunging into the language and culture of Italy this summer, and 20 Italian visitors will find out what it's like to live and study in southern Ontario.

The switch is part of a summer immersion exchange program being arranged by St. Jerome's. The Canadian students will take courses on the campus of the University of Bologna, while the Italian students will have the opportunity to observe classes at St. Jerome's.

Dr. Vera Golini, assistant professor of Italian Studies at St. Jerome's, said that the Canadian students will be encouraged to speak no English during their six-week immersion course, running from June 8 to July 17. Those attending will have completed basic Italian studies, and will have "the rudiments of the language" before enrolling.

"But then," she said, "they will have to learn the language beyond the elements of survival." The course instructor will be close by, however, to help the student adjust.

While in Bologna, the students will live with Italian families, sharing their homes, their meals, and their activities. Accommodation is provided free for their first four weeks.

The Canadians will also join students from the University of Bologna for group excursions to vineyards, folk festivals, the opera, art galleries and museums. Dr. Golini is currently helping to arrange a month's accommodation for the 20 Italian students with families in Kitchener-Waterloo, Brantford, Cambridge and Guelph. The visitors are scheduled to arrive for a month in mid-July.

"This kind of familial immersion is very meaningful," she pointed out.

"Most of the students have spent at least two years studying English."

While they are here, the Italian visitors will be taken to visit other sites in Ontario to experience various examples of Canadian culture.

"We would like to give them the opportunity to see things which are totally Canadian," Dr. Golini said.

In turn, the students may be able to give Italian folk demonstrations, since they have been trained in singing and dancing.

Dr. Golini said that Bologna makes an ideal site for the summer course overseas. Situated in the Appenines, the city is "at the crossroads of Italy."

Bologna is the oldest university town in Italy, the home of the famous law faculty founded in 1158.

The city is architecturally interesting too, she pointed out.

"The city is famous for its medieval towers as well as for its arcades and porticos."

Cost of return air fare and tuition for two courses is \$2,000 and students are advised to allow for \$300 in additional expenses. The courses will concentrate on conversation, composition, and a study of the sociocultural, historical and artistic aspects of Italian life.

Dean Letson to Receive Distinguished TeachingAward



Dr. Douglas Letson has been honoured by the University of Waterloo with a Distinguished Teacher Award. The award was one of three approved by the University Senate on March 16.

These awards, designed to recognize excellence in teaching over a number of years, are made annually on the basis of nominations by past and present students and by colleagues.

Dr. Letson is Associate Professor of English Literature and is well known to many of us for his courses in Introductory English, Canadian Literature, Old English and Middle English. A St. Jerome's graduate, he has been Dean of the College since 1975. He will be honoured at the University Convocation May 28.

Letters praising his work as a teacher were received by the Selection Committee from current students, as well as from alumni Dr. Letson taught up to eleven years ago.

"It feels good to know that so many people have gone out of their way to support my nomination," he said. Dr. Letson attributes his success in the classroom to a strong interest in his subject and students.

"Essentially, what I hope to do in class is generate an interest in literature as well as the ideas expressed in that literature," he said. Individual discussions with students after his class is ended are natural and fairly regular kind of thing.



Men's Residence to be Expanded

The construction of a new residence building for the Priests of the Congregation of the Resurrection will free space for more student accommodation. For the past 18 years, eight members of the Congregation have occupied the main floor of the Men's Residence.

The completion of the new facilities, some time before the end of 1981, will make nine semi-private rooms available for senior students. The large semi-private rooms will include an ensuite washroom.

The addition of 18 more spaces by January 1982 will increase the capacity of the residence to 127 men in double, single, and semi-private rooms.
