It appears that we will have a reduced width to the sidewalk outside the building so that neither the cemetery or the schoolhouse will be moved. The new sidewalk will be 3.4 m. from the front door of the schoolhouse. We have asked that the streetscaping be in keeping with the heritage feel of the school & cemetery. Chisholm Veterans of the War



In September Jane Watt & Ross Wark accepted an invitation to tour and photograph the James Forte property on Tremaine Rd. his 5 plus acre property was once part of Trafalgar Twp.; now a part of rural Milton. The main house called the McFadden house, was built in 1912 and has been completely restored inside. It bears a heritage designation. The second house, the Hunter House, was built c. 1830-1835 and is in ruins. Mr. Forte plans to have it taken apart brick by brick and restored on the property in 2013. Salary

Clerks 25p a year; Treasurer 2% of income; Auditor 2 shillings a day; Superintendent of Education 25p

Clerk of the Peace ?

The first few by-laws cover the 25 ft. clearing of land required for the highway, circus rules, stray animals, and noxious weeds.

Sidewalks for the Village of Oakville. East side of Navy from Colborne to the pier. The main Street already has planks. Cost is \$50. William Romain, Robert Leach and James Reid appointed as Commissioners for the sidewalks

Budget

\$250 Schools

\$125 Bridges

\$248 General Costs

\$623

Guards and posts required

On the 16 at Dundas on the west side. Phillip Triller and Samuel Bowman Commissioners

At 4th Line on the north side of the 16 Andrew Robertson and John Askin Commissioners

A bridge at lot 13 on Dundas is required for public safety without delay. James Appelbe, Michael Snider and Hiram Post Commissioners

Subscribe for shares in Trafalgar, Esquesing and Erin Road Company. \$2,000 p. issue debentures

Tavern and other licence fees to pay the interest

Bylaw 16 -April 24, 1850 the Common Seal for the Township was established. "In the centre an oak tree having a crown on its trunk with her Majesty's initials on each side.
