Introduction

This is a transcription of documents from Volumes 16 and 17, two of thirty-nine volumes of pay records and accounts of the Upper Canada Militia during the time of the War of 1812. In 2012 [Collections Canada](#) published digital copies of the microfilmed volumes on their website.

These images were easier to see and work with than those transcribed from a microfilm viewer or photocopies, in 2010. In this edition, corrections were made, some additional documents were added, and the documents were indexed to the digital images online.

The transcribed documents included company and staff payrolls as well as returns of officers (documents 5 and 7), returns of horses (documents 26, 28, and 29), selection of flank companies (documents 113 to 115), recommended promotions (document 93A), and fines collected (document 10). Most documents had a stamped archival number but many documents appear to be missing from the set. Possibly these were documents that were no longer legible enough to microfilm. The documents were not always in numerical order on the microfilm. Documents were copied by hand during the war and there are multiple copies of some payrolls with different document numbers. Corrections and changes were made to the documents by the authors when this occurred. When there was more than one copy of the same document only one copy was transcribed and any significant changes between copies were noted in the transcriber's comments, in square brackets.

Some document titles included where the unit was stationed. Remarks on the documents may give insight as to what was happening in each company. The documents did not directly indicate that the men were at specific engagements but the remarks may have suggested that they were. Examples of this type of remark beside a man's name are "wounded" and "taken prisoner". Officers were required to sign for receipt of their pay on separate payrolls. There were sometimes additional documents covering the same pay period. Most documents were certified as true and signed by an officer but not necessarily in the same year as the payroll period.

Pay amounts and certification statements were not transcribed. Daily pay rates were:

The 2nd Regiment of York Militia was drawn from men living in the townships of Trafalgar, Toronto, Nelson, East and West Flamborough, Ancaster, Barton, Beverly, and Saltfleet, which mostly formed the western part of York County at that time. These townships later became part of the counties of Peel, Halton, and Wentworth and are now in the area from Oakville to Hamilton. Militia laws at times required all men from 16 to 60 to report for muster duty in the regiment in their area. The muster rolls therefore also served as a partial census of who was living in the area. However, a number of men received exemptions from service for various reasons. About 700 men's names appeared in these payrolls from 1812 to 1814. Men did not always report for duty in the same company or even the same regiment. A number of men who served in the 2nd York also served in the 5th Lincoln.

Names may have been spelled differently on different payrolls and even on subsequent copies of the same payrolls. The assumption can usually be made that a given name belonged to only one man but there were a number of families with two or more generations of men with the same name. There were also a number of large families living in the area but all the men sharing that surname were not necessarily related.

A number of problems had to be resolved in the transcription process because of the documents' deterioration, illegible hand writing, spelling errors, and incomplete dates. In some cases, there were men with different spellings for what may have been the same surname. While it is quite likely that Ensign William McKerlie and Ensign William McCarly was the same person it is not as clear whether Privates John Caygy, John Hagy, John Kaygay, and John Ragy were the same person. The transcriber has explained his rationale for dating the undated documents with the transcriptions of those documents below.

A number of men served in more than one regiment during the war. This was particularly true of the men in the 5th Lincoln and 2nd York Militias. Men from the 2nd York served with men of the 5th Lincoln under 5th Lincoln officers on a number of

occasions including the Capture of Fort Detroit. Both regiments appeared to have been mustering from the same townships but the transfer of men between regiments was probably facilitated when both regiments were stationed at Burlington Heights. There are examples of men who were transferred between companies within a regiment to even out the number of men in the companies and it appeared that the same was done between these two regiments.

Finding payrolls for particular historical events can help clarify who took part in those events. The following were the engagements in which the 2nd York took part and the related payroll documents:

August 15, 1812, the Capture of Fort Detroit, under Capt. Samuel Hatt, 5th Lincoln

The transcriber has used these and other documents to compile an alphabetical muster roll for the 2nd York. He is in the process of writing a biography for each of the men who served in this regiment and welcomes enquiries.
