As development continues in the area north of Dundas Street, more elementary and secondary schools will be built.

*It is noteworthy that Boyne, Palermo, and Munn's school were all built at this time to replace the old buildings. Boyne was SS #1, Palermo SS#2, and Munn's SS#3, possibly indicating that they were the first three schools established in the Township. According to the 1817 Gourley Report for Trafalgar Township, there were only three schools by that time.
