The family story is that Irish immigrant Thomas Shea met a man named Joe Brown on the boat over. Joe recommended that Thomas go to the Tobin farm in Trafalgar Township as they "would put him up". Thomas did, he met Bridget and Patrick's granddaughter, Frances. Thomas Shea and Frances Tobin were married April 28, 1862 in St. Andrew's Church, Oakville. They took over the farm.



The farm was in the Snyder's Corners area, Burnhamthorpe Rd. E. Descendent Thomas Vincent Shea, called Tom, born in 1876 and died in 1965, used these whippletrees with his draught horse team. Here is a link to our internet record of this photograph and information:
