THE INSTALLATION OF THE CHANCELLOR

The Secretary of the Senate, Dr. Lloyd H. Schaus, will announce the election of William Daum Euler to the Office of Chancellor.

The Chairman of the Board of Governors, the Rev. John M. Zimmerman, will administer the following oath of office:

“Sir, you are now to assume the function and office of Chancellor of this University, to which you have been duly appointed. You shall now swear to keep and preserve, well and faithfully, during your period of office, the statutes, liberties, customs, rights and privileges of the University, and to promote its well-being and that of its members so far as in you lies.”

The Chancellor-elect will take oath saying:

“I, William Daum Euler, undertake in the strength which God shall give me to perform to the best of my ability the duties of Chancellor of Waterloo Lutheran University; and I promise as highest academic officer of this University to defend its rights and promote its welfare.”

The Chairman of the Board of Governors will install the Chancellor, saying:

“Sir, by the authority of the Board of Governors and the Senate, I now install you in the office of Chancellor of Waterloo Lutheran University, and I invest you with the authority and charge you with the responsibilities which appertain to this high office.”

The Chancellor will be invested with the robes of office by the Vice-President of the Board of Governors, the Rev. Paul W. H. Eydt, and the Secretary, Mr. Gregor Lund.

The Bedel, Dr. H. O. Overgaard, will present the Mace to the Chancellor. The placing of the Mace before the Chancellor signifies that Convocation has commenced.

The Mace for this First Convocation is the Mace of the Council of the Northwest Territories. Its presence here has been made possible by the Honourable Walter Dinsdale, Minister of Northern Affairs and National Resources, as a token of appreciation for the services of Superintendent Henry A. Larsen, R.C.M.P., to the Northwest Territories.

THE CONFERRING OF DEGREES

The Honourable George Harris Hees will address Convocation.

The Vice-Chairman of the Senate, Dr. J. Ray Houser, will present to the Chancellor candidates from Waterloo Lutheran Seminary and Waterloo University College for degrees in course and for diplomas and certificates.

The Public Orators, who will announce the candidates, will be Dr. Ulrich S. Leupold for Waterloo Lutheran Seminary and Professor James M. Clark for Waterloo University College. Professors R. C. Teigen and D. F. Morgenson will invest the candidates with the academic hoods. The Marshall for Convocation is Professor G. F. Durst; the Organist is Miss Louise Germann.

The Rev. Dr. Martin L. Dolbeer will pronounce the Benediction.
