The audience will rise as the Procession enters and will remain standing for the Hymn and Invocation.

THE INSTALLATION OF THE PRESIDENT AND VICE-CHANCELLOR

The Rev. Dr. A. W. Lotz, The President of the Synod, will say: "Having been authorized to install as President and Vice-Chancellor of Waterloo Lutheran University, the Rev. Dr. William John Villaume, I now ask for the certification of his call."

Mr. Gregor Lund, the Secretary of the Board of Governors, will read the certification of the call and election, and then give it to the President of the Synod.

The Rev. John M. Zimmerman, Chairman of the Board of Governors, will then present the President-elect.

The President of the Synod will say:

"William John Villaume, you are about to assume the responsibilities of the office of President and Vice-Chancellor of Waterloo Lutheran University.

"Hear, then, the duties to which you have been called: As the chief executive officer, it will be your duty to provide educational leadership and administrative direction to the whole life and activity of the University; to develop objectives and policies in accordance with a Christian philosophy of education; to execute all decisions of the Board of Governors of the University. It will furthermore be your duty to give leadership to the University so that it may play its full part in the cultural life of this community and the nation. All this you will do within the framework of a Christian philosophy of life.

"I now ask you, in the presence of God and of this company, whether you are willing to accept these responsibilities of your office and whether you are ready to promise faithfully to perform the duties thereof."

The President-elect will say:

"I do so accept and do so promise."

The President of the Synod will say:

"I now ask the President of the Board of Governors to give you the official gown and cap and the Secretary to give you the Charter as symbols of your office." The President of Synod will say:

"Upon this your solemn promise, I do now declare you to be the President and Vice-Chancellor of Waterloo Lutheran University, with all the rights, privileges and obligations pertaining to that office. On behalf of the Church and the University, I extend sincere best wishes and pray that your labours may be fruitful and that God's Truth will be your way, God's Light your guide, God's Power your strength, and God's Grace your peace. God bless you. Amen."

The Bedel, Dr. H. O. J. Overgaard, will present the Mace to the Vice-Chancellor. The placing of the Mace before the Vice-Chancellor signifies that Convocation has commenced.
