<u>Free Public Interest Lectures</u> Again Offered By University

A series of free public-interest lectures will again be offered by Wilfrid Laurier University, Waterloo, in a number of fields of interest to those in the community.

Prof. J.M. Clark, director of extension, said the lectures were begun three years ago so that faculty members could share areas of special interest with persons interested in informal sessions in a university setting.

More than 500 persons have attended the lectures to date.

The first two series this fall begin Oct. 17 and will continue on Oct. 24 and Oct. 31.

Prof. Robert Langen of the philosophy department will look at modern art under the title Is that monstrosity art? and Prof. Ilse Stewart of the department of romance languages will discuss French Cnaadian literature in translation.

All public interest lectures will be held in the Athletic Building at King Street and University Avenue. A number of other topics are under preparation.
