Summer session features buffet
as WLU students begin studies

It's summer and vacation time for many students throughout Ontario. But it's back to the books for those attending summer session beginning July 4 at Wilfrid Laurier University.

About 1,500 persons will be attending classes in Waterloo, Orillia, Barrie and, for the first time, in Penetanguishine. Most classes are offered during the day but a number are offered in the evenings as a convenience to those combining work with education.

At Waterloo, an outdoor buffet on July 6 will serve as an ice-breaking event, allowing students to share a meal with their fellow students and their professors.

Large outdoor tables will feature platters of cold meats, various salads, deep fried shrimp, sweet and sour chicken, cold drinks, with cake and ice-cream for dessert.

Those attending summer session include business persons, housewives, teachers, regular WLU students, as well as transfer students from other universities and Grade 12 (Year 4) students getting a head start on their university careers, and others. They can take one or two credits of the 15 needed for a degree by Aug. 12.
