Course available for persons  
other than residents of Hespeler home

A full credit university course to be offered Saturday mornings this fall in the Hespeler area of Cambridge is open to all, not just residents of St. Luke's Place where it will be taught.

Arthur Knowles, director of continuing education at Wilfrid Laurier University, made that announcement today because many people have not realized the WLU course is open to all interested persons.

The course, in Canadian history, is the outgrowth of several interest courses offered in the new residence last year by WLU.

"While many residents of the home have enrolled, the course is open to anyone interested in a degree or who would like to gain new insights into the people and events of this country's history," Mr. Knowles said.

The course is offered at no charge to anyone more than 60 years of age, in line with WLU policy. Others may take it at the regular fee of \$145 or take it simply for interest at a fee of \$72.50.
