Three students, all girls, win
\$2,000 WLU entrance scholarships

Three Ontario high school students--all girls--have been awarded \$2,000 entrance scholarships to Wilfrid Laurier University.

The winners are Pamela Jean Dexter of Kenora, a graduate of Lakewood Secondary School; Janice Herring, 12 Lisa Rd., Scarborough, a graduate of Woburn Collegiate Institute; and Nancy L. Wiens, 148 Warren Rd., Kitchener, a graduate of Forest Heights Collegiate.

Announcement of the awards, known as Centennial Scholarships, was made by Horace Braden, director of placement and student awards at WLU.

The three winners averaged 90 per cent or more in six Grade 13 subjects in order to qualify.

In addition, 133 Laurier Scholarships were also presented by university. These awards, valued at \$500 each, went to students who averaged 80 per cent or more in six Grade 13 subjects.

Students from high schools across the province vied to win the WLU scholarships.
