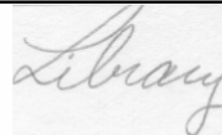

Arnold Edinborough, Mark MacGuigan  
to discuss prison reform in WLU lecture

Prison reform will be discussed by two outstanding Canadians at Wilfrid Laurier University Nov. 2 in a free, public lecture at 8 p.m. in Room 1E1, Arts Building.

Arnold Edinborough, one of Canada's best known men of letters, and Mark MacGuigan, MP for Windsor-Walkerville, and chairman of the Commons subcommittee on the Canadian Penitentiary System will share the podium.

They will be taking part in the fourth annual Easton-McCarney Memorial Lecture, sponsored by the WLU social work faculty and the fund established in memory of John Easton and Christopher McCarney.

Dr. MacGuigan will question whether our present prison system reforms or deforms and Mr. Edinborough will consider the necessity of deinstitutionalizing Canadian correctional services.

MacGuigan is a former dean of law at the University of Windsor and has written two textbooks in that field. Edinborough is well-known for his regular columns in the Canadian Churchman and the Financial Post and is former editor of Saturday Night.
