Career Counsellor Appointed at WLU

Information Day for Guidance Counsellors

The WLU High School Liaison Office is hosting an Information Day for area guidance counsellors March 5. About 100 counsellors are expected to participate in the activities, which include a talk on Stress in Modern Society by Dr. Don Morgenson of WLU's Psychology Department. Dr. Morgenson is a noted public speaker, and appears in WLU's Telecollege on Grand River Cable Television. The Dean and Associate Dean of the School of Business and Economics, Dr. Max Stewart and Dr. Tupper Cawsey, will also address the high school counsellors. They will discuss University Business Programs in the Eighties, including projections on content, new directions, and whether there will be too many or too few business graduates.

Singers to Participate in Festival

The Victor Martens Chamber Singers will perform at the Guelph Spring Festival along with the Back choir, under the direction of Nicholas Goldschmidt. The Chamber Singers are a recently-formed semi-professional choir in Waterloo. Their carefully balanced voices are capable of performing the most difficult choral repertoire. The group is led by Professor Victor Martens, head of vocal music at Wilfrid Laurier University. Several of the Chamber Singers are former WLU students who have made time in their professional singing careers to participate in this highly skilled group. The Singers will perform in Guelph May 8 and 9, and in Kitchener May 12 and 13.

Business Managers to Judge Student Skills

Businessmen from the K-W area will serve as members of the "jury" when third-year Business students at Wilfrid Laurier University go through a problem-solving exercise next month. WLU will bring in managers of local businesses to serve on five "External Boards of Directors", before which the business students, working in teams, must present their solutions to special problems. The businessmen will be on campus March 7. Regular classes for the students are suspended during the week, while they research and collect information to solve "cases" or problems relating to business. The Third-Year Integrated Exercise continues throughout the week of March 3, with teams of students being chosen by "internal" boards made up of WLU faculty members before the finalists appear before the local businessmen.
