U.S. cold war historian to lecture
at WLU on resumption of freeze

Walter LaFeber of Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y., probably the most influential American historian on the cold war, will give a free, public lecture on the subject Oct. 7 at Wilfrid Laurier University at 3 p.m.

He will speak in the main lecture hall of the Frank C. Peters Building, University Avenue and Albert Street, Waterloo, on: "Cold War II and the U.S. Presidential Election."

Dr. LaFeber has written a number of books on the cold war, the best-known being *America, Russia and the Cold War 1945-1970*.

This special, timely lecture is a presentation of Laurier's history department.
