Steps toward banking fellowship
marked by WLU dinner, presentation

Seventeen Kitchener-Waterloo and area bankers received letters of accomplishment and three were named associates of the Institute of Canadian Bankers at a ceremony this week at Bingeman Park Lodge.

The university credit courses are given by Wilfrid Laurier University, one of several universities across the province designated to teach the academic program for bankers.

A Fellowship in the Institute of Canadian Bankers (FICB) is awarded after completion of 10 full credit courses from an approved program at Laurier.

The Fellowship provides bankers with the professional management skills needed to meet the needs of their customers in these rapidly changing times.

Speaker for the occasion was Hugh W. Sloan of Kitchener, president of Budd Canada, Inc. He discussed the future of the auto industry in Canada and the importance of employee relations as Canada enters the 1980s.

Laurier has been involved in teaching bankers for 13 years in conjunction with the Institute of Canadian Bankers, an educational body sponsored by all Canadian chartered banks.
