WLU offers academic courses
in settings with a difference

Now that winter's coming it may be time to consider spending some time in the sunny Mediterranean area next summer--and earn a university credit toward a degree while seeing some of the world's outstanding scenery.

The learning trip, sponsored by Wilfrid Laurier University, should appeal to those interested in fine arts and the Renaissance era in general.

Four credit courses toward a degree will be offered at Florence, Italy.

Courses offered are History of Art from the Middle Ages to the Present, Aesthetics Studio; History of the Renaissance in Florence; and a fine arts course, Theories of Beauty.

Those teaching are regular members of the WLU faculty: Dr. Ilse Friesen, Michael Manson, Dr. Arlene M. Guinsburg and Prof. Robert Langen.

The six-week program will cost \$2,500, plus \$160 tuition for each full-year course taken.

Included in this fee is round-trip airfare to Rome, transfers to Florence, double accommodation with bath in a centrally-located hotel, and a weekly trip by coach to points of interest related to the teaching program. The charter flight departs Toronto on June 28, 1981.
