Collingwood information night
to provide university answers

Twenty-seven people from Collingwood and area are now enrolled in a credit course with Wilfrid Laurier University and more have indicated an interest.

In order to find out how many Collingwood residents would like to take courses at Laurier, and to provide answers about university education, Wilfrid Laurier University will hold an information night Oct. 3 from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. at the Collingwood Collegiate.

Clifford G. Bilyea, acting director of part-time studies at Laurier, will be on hand to answer questions and to provide information about courses that could be offered.

He pointed out that more people are eligible for admission to the university than some may suppose. Anyone with Grade 12 and two years work experience or anyone 21 years of age or over is eligible. Those 60 years of age and over may take courses without paying course fees.

Bilyea said the university offered its first course in Collingwood in 1977. This fall, students are attending a course taught by Dr. David Granskou on the life and letters of Paul, the apostle.
