Social work lecture at Laurier  
to peer into the 21st century

Dr. Leon H. Ginsberg, a social work educator and author, will discuss Social Work Education and Practice in the 21st Century when he speaks Sept. 25 at Wilfrid Laurier University at 8 p.m.

He will be delivering the 13th annual Easton-McCarney Memorial lecture that night in the main auditorium of the Frank C. Peters Building. The talk is offered without charge and those attending will be invited to meet the speaker over refreshments following the lecture.

The lecture comes as the Laurier social work faculty marks its 20th anniversary. It is also the 75th anniversary of the founding of the university.

Ginsberg, a former chancellor of West Virginia University, is currently a professor of social work at the University of South Carolina.
