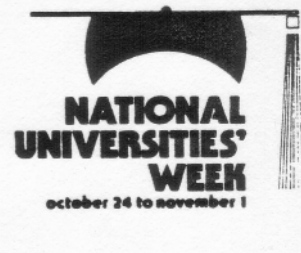

Inclusive language among topics

for Lutheran Life Lectures Nov. 4

The use of inclusive language and the need for more women clergy will be among the topics when Dr. Mary Malone, a Roman Catholic teacher and author, gives the annual Lutheran Life Lectures Nov. 4 at 2:30 and 7:30 p.m. at St. John's Lutheran Church, 22 Willow St., Waterloo.

Malone, who teaches at St. Jerome's College of the University of Waterloo, will speak on the topic: Inclusiveness in pastoral ministry and congregations. The talks are sponsored by Waterloo Lutheran Seminary and the Lutheran Life Insurance Society of Canada.

At the afternoon session, Malone will discuss the question-- how can pastors be instrumental in helping their parishes become an inclusive reality? At the second lecture, two questions will be looked at: How can the parish be experienced as inclusive? How can the parish be the body of Christ?

Malone has written several works in theology, and, before coming to St. Jerome's College, taught at the Toronto School of Theology and St. Augustine's Seminary, Toronto. Her doctoral dissertation was on Christian attitudes towards women in the fourth century.
