Welfare as viewed by its recipients topic of Laurier colloquium

welfare from the perspective of its recipients will be the topic of the next colloquium presented by the faculty of social work at Wilfrid Laurier University on Feb. 2.

David Woodsworth, a professor emeritus at McGill University in Montreal, will discuss what welfare means to its recipients and how they can be subordinated to political purposes.

He is currently involved with two social action groups in Notre-Dame de Grace of Montreal: an anti-poverty group which is resisting welfare reform in Quebec and a senior citizens' council.

A leading figure in social work education, Woodsworth has published <u>Social Security and National Policy: Sweden</u>,

Yugoslavia and Japan and <u>Welfare as Politics in Sri Lanka</u>.

The colloquium will be presented in Rm. 2C2 of the Arts and Science Building from 3:30 p.m. to 5 p.m.
