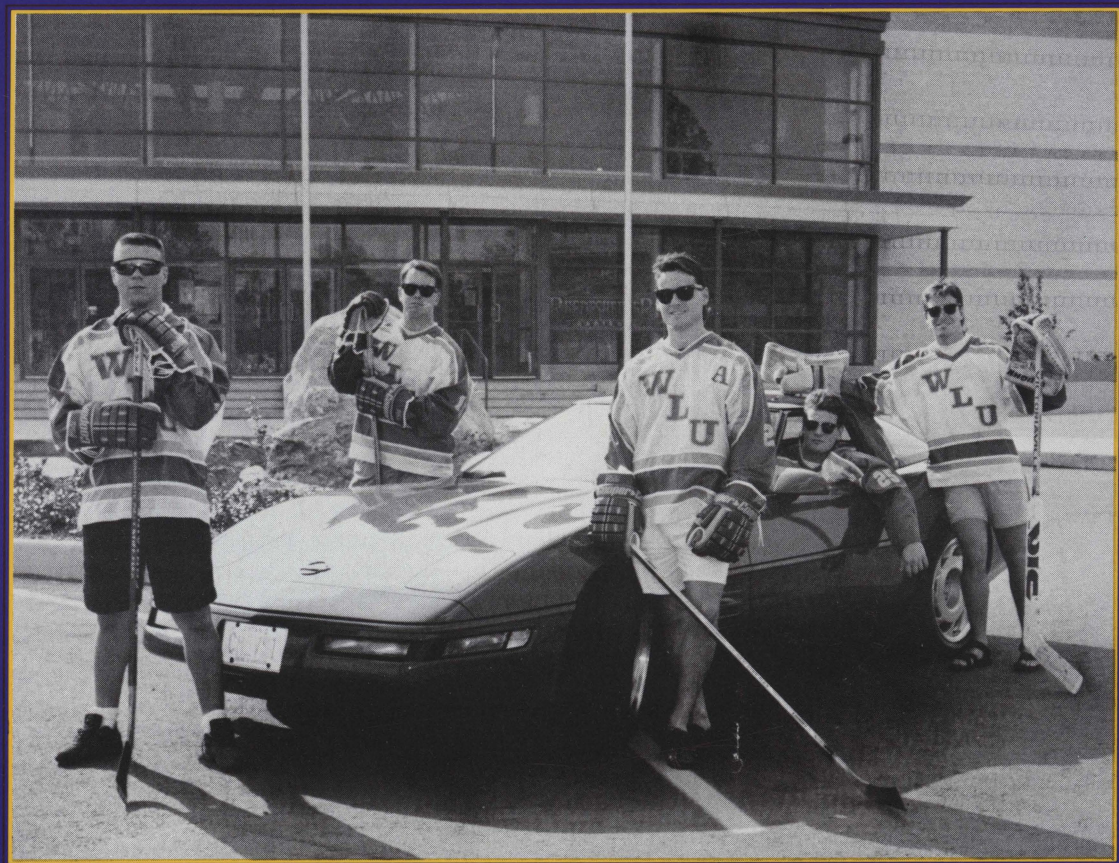

HAWKS HEAD COACH...WAYNE GOWING

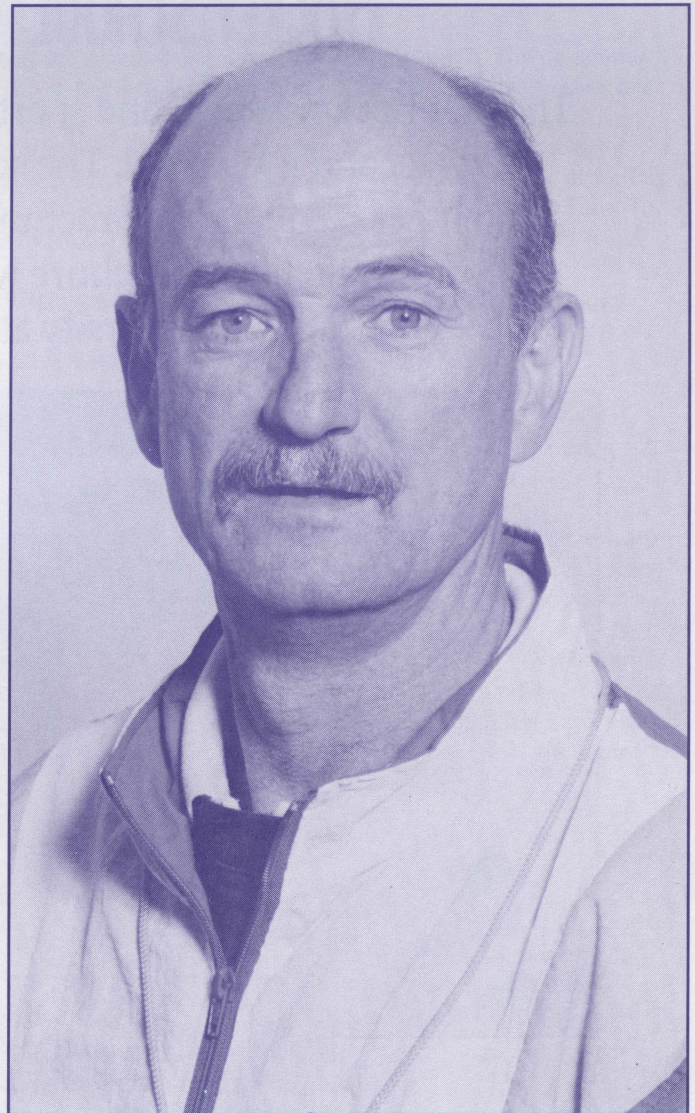
Wayne Gowing is entering his 21st season as Head Coach of the Golden Hawks. A Kitchener native, where Wayne played through the minor hockey system as well as spending 3 seasons with the then Jr. B Greenshirts and a winter with the Jr. A Rangers.

Wayne accepted an athletic scholarship to play hockey for Boston University in 1967. After four years with the Terriers, Wayne graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education and an NCAA Division 1 hockey championship ring from his senior year. Wayne then moved on to pursue a Master of Education degree at Kent State University. Wayne played club hockey at Kent and also served as the teams Assistant Coach.

Upon graduating from Kent State in 1973, Wayne became the first full-time hockey coach in Laurier's history. Over the past twenty years, Coach Gowing has compiled a league record of 264 wins, 126 losses and 43 ties for a .659 winning percentage. During this time, Gowing's Laurier teams have captured 3 OUAA championships and made 4 appearances in the CIAU Nationals Tournament. Last year Wayne was selected OUAA coach of the year for the fourth time in his career.

Coach Gowing's teams have always taken pride in having a strong, very physical work ethic in practice and carrying this work ethic over into game situations. Although Wayne is looking forward to the challenge of adapting his coaching philosophy to the much larger ice surface of the new Rec Complex, this year's team should continue to be very aggressive and physical.

Coach Gowing is a certified Instructor for the National Coaching Certification Program and in the off season, Wayne manages the Wilfrid Laurier University Golden Hawks hockey school along with instructing at other hockey schools. Wayne and his wife Heather reside in Kitchener with their two sons Darren and Matthew.

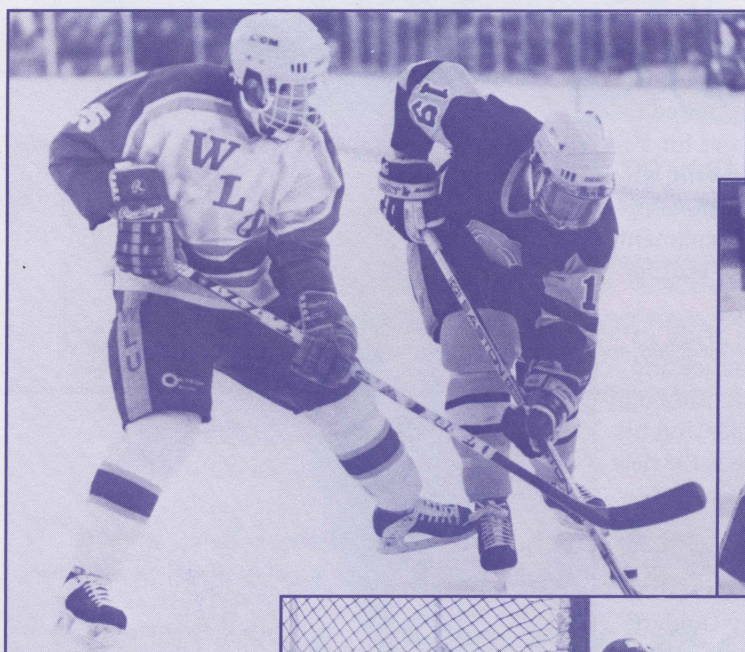

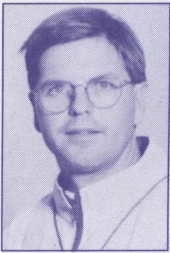

Coach Martindale is entering his sixth season as Assistant coach of the Hawk defencemen. The Caledonia Minor Hockey grad also played two years for the hometown Jr. B Corvairs under the tutelage of his father, Chester.

DAVE MATTHEWS

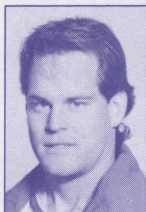

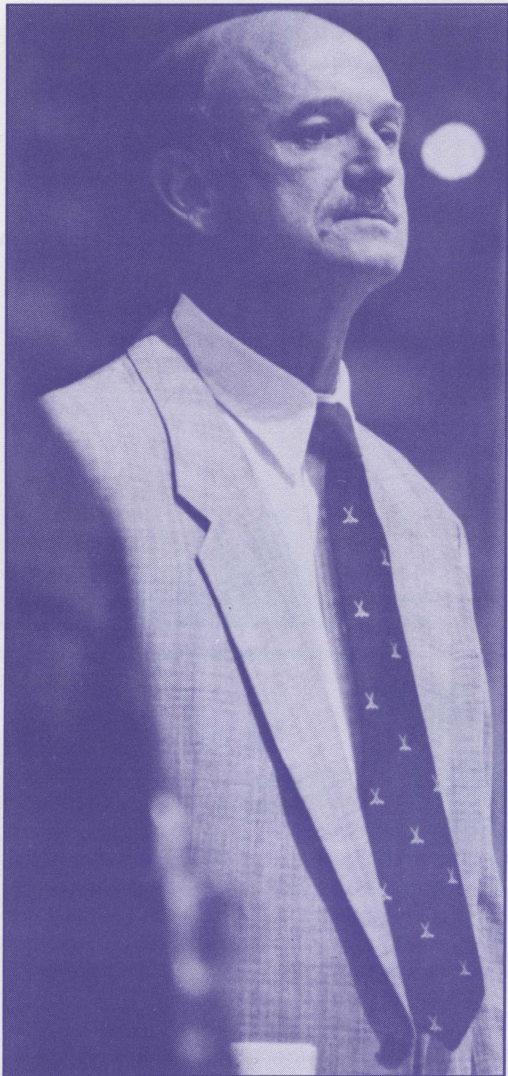

Laurier Coach Is Excited About New Hockey Arena.

In his 21 years as the head coach of the Wilfrid Laurier Golden Hawks, coach Wayne Gowing has never seen anything like the new Waterloo Recreational Complex.

Gowing compares the move from the Waterloo Arena (Bubble) to the Mutual Arena as a giant leap.

"We played out to the Kitchener (Memorial) Auditorium up until the 1982/83 season, then moved to the Bubble, but if you take the dressing rooms from Kitchener and the Bubble, this one here would still be bigger," Gowing said. "The City (of Waterloo) has really accommodated us and the (Waterloo) Siskins.

"The ice is great and well lit and it's going to be hard to find anything wrong with this facility."

Gowing had his team on the ice for the first time this year last Thursday night in an-exhibition game against the Siskins. Siskins won the game 5-2, but for Gowing and his players, it was the first time this preseason that they've worked together.

"It just shows you that a team that's conditioned for two weeks and trying to make the grade can play well, especially against a higher-calibre team such as ours. However, most of these (Hawks) guys are just coming off a long summer."

The game itself was a showcase for the Recreational Centre and there was very little motivation on the Hawk bench.

Hawks have 21 returning players and the only new faces on the team are Joel Bishop, Gavin Christie and former Siskin defenceman Shawn Way.

Gowing is predicting huge crowds during a Hawks/Waterloo Warriors university clash and the 3,500 seat arena will no doubt be filled to the roof.

However, with the Tournament of Hearts curling championships coming to the arena this February, Hawks will miss the first, possibly second round of the playoffs. Instead, they've already made plans to move the playoffs to the Kitchener Memorial Auditorium. These playoffs usually involve a hard-fought series between the two local universities, and there's the question' Will the students travel to Kitchener to follow the series.

"I'd like to think that Waterloo and Laurier could play on the moon and still get a full house."

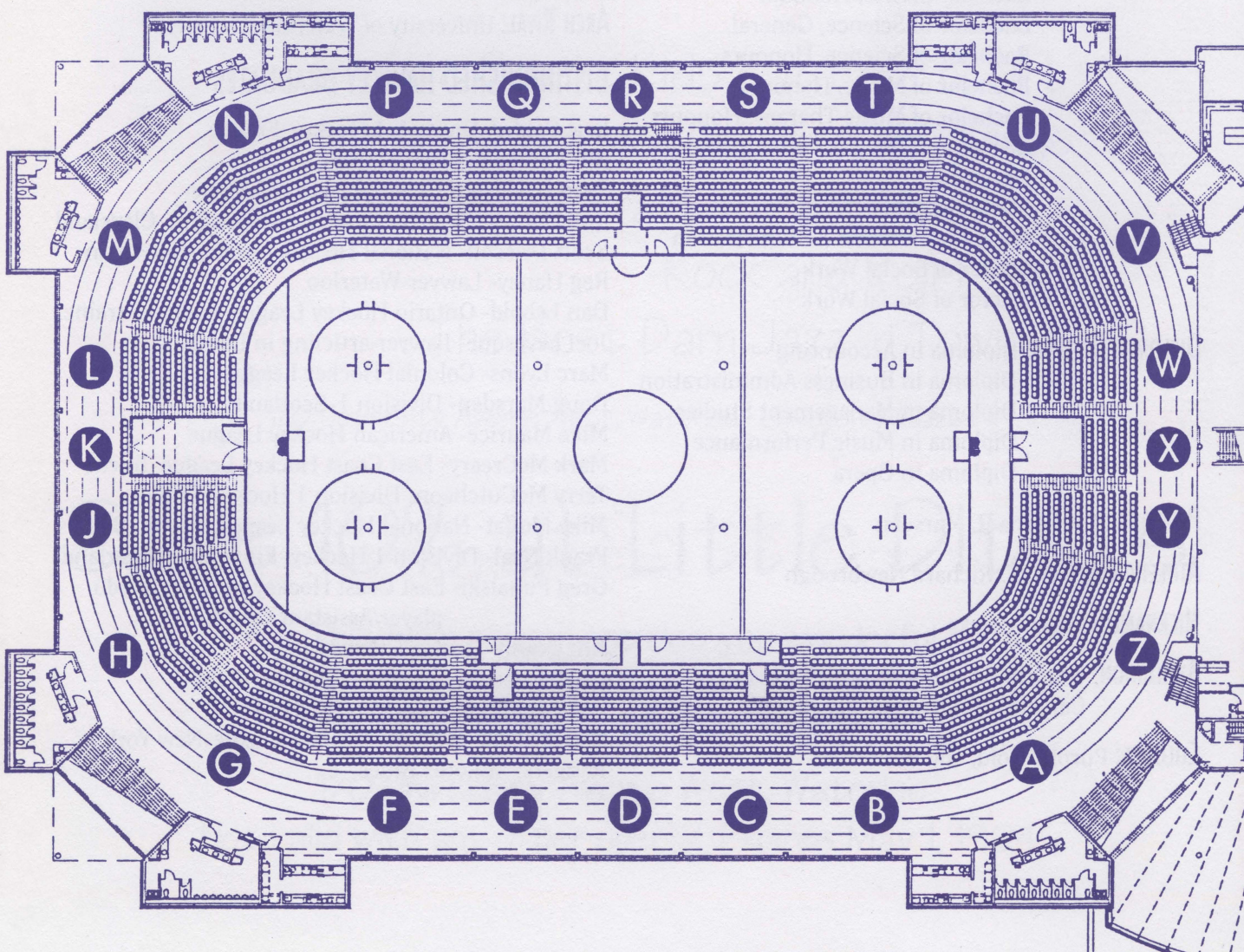

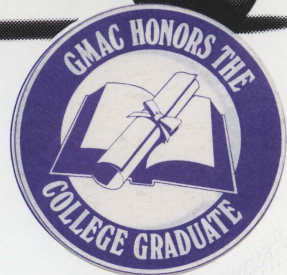
