

WOMEN'S AUXILIARY

The 1963 annual meeting of the Women's Auxiliary of Waterloo Lutheran University was held in the Theatre-Auditorium on the campus on September 25, 1963, at 2:30 p.m.

Mrs. Robert Rudy of Tavistock was devotions leader. She reminded us that God had a purpose in life for each one of us, and that with God's help and guidance we can fulfil His holy purpose.

Mrs. Harry Greb, the Auxiliary President, welcomed the members and presented Dr. William J. Villaume, President of Waterloo Lutheran University. He voiced the appreciation of the Administration, the Board and the Faculty for the contribution the Women's Auxiliary is providing toward the education and training of Christian leaders, both pastors and laymen, for our Church and nation.

Dr. Lloyd D. Schaus, Dean of the Faculty of Arts, spoke of his close association with the Auxiliary ever since he first came to Waterloo as a student 39 years ago.

Mr. Archie McLean, President of the Students' Council, lauded the Women's Auxiliary for the work they are doing in the dormitories and for their assistance as hostesses at the various social functions.

Pastor F. Wagschal, University Pastor, feels that the Auxiliary should rejoice and be glad that they CAN have a share in so important a part of the Lord's work as the training of pastors and laymen for Christian service.

Dr. J. Ray Hauser, President of the Faculty of Theology, expressed his joy for the women's contribution toward the new Seminary Building and for the increased enrolment in the Seminary - the largest class in its history.

Mr. James Bindernagel, President of the Waterloo Lutheran Seminary Students' Council, had a special word of gratitude for our support of the Seminary Library, and reminded us of the dedication of the new Seminary Building on October 20, at 2:30 p.m.

Mrs. H. Greb, in her report as President, gave a review of the stewardship of the Executive Board on behalf of the Auxiliary throughout the year. She challenged the women of our church to continued dedication to the purposes of this organization.

The minutes of the annual meeting of September 26, 1962, were accepted as circulated. The secretary read a brief extract of the minutes to refresh our memories.

The Treasurer's report with audit was accepted. She reported a balance as of January 1, 1962, of \$2881.46, receipts of \$9058.49, expenditures of \$11,139.45 and a balance in Bank, Dec. 31, 1962, of \$800.50. The membership receipts to date for 1963 total \$4766.68, a decrease of \$568.92.

The Roll Call was answered by an attendance of 271, representing 34 congregations.

The Promotional Secretary, Mrs. G. Raymond, reviewed the work of her committee which can best be described as a process of education until every woman of our synod supports the Auxiliary. The report was accepted.

(Note - Refreshments are provided by the University, the committee is responsible for the planning and serving.)

Residence donations were received as follows - 78 quilts, 21 mats, 1 comforter, 17 blankets, 2 mattresses. A detailed list of donors was provided for the members.

The Executive Board submitted the following recommendation -

The recommendation was adopted.

Mrs. O. O. Ireland, on behalf of the Auxiliary, paid tribute to Mrs. W. Klinck who served for four years as chairman of projects and one year as secretary. Mrs. Klinck has resigned.

Mrs. W. Hachborn introduced the key speaker of the afternoon, Dr. Henry Endress, Vice-President and Director of University Resources. He employed graphic display cards to point up the university's rapid growth in a mere three years. In 1960 there were 3 buildings and now there are 13; full-time students increased from 580 to 1320; summer session students from 87 to 714; and the university faculty increased from 41 to 86. Twenty-five different religious faiths are represented in the student body. Dr. Endress outlined the plans for the development program of the future.

The meeting was adjourned.

The ladies were invited to tour the various buildings on the campus after partaking of coffee served in the foyer.

At 7 p.m. a dinner for 290 guests was served in the Dining Hall when Dr. John Wettlaufer, Dean of the School of Business Administration, University of Western Ontario, was the special speaker. He described the forces that have weakened the students' ability to meet the problems of modern society. He told of the work our church is doing for Lutheran students on campuses of Ontario universities. The Lutheran Student Movement, Lutheran Student Centres, University Chaplains and the establishment of campus congregations endeavour to help the student to cope with their problems. Mr. Wettlaufer studied at Waterloo University College and is a former member of the University's Board of Governors.

Miss Arlette Pederson, assistant to the President of Waterloo Lutheran University, was master of ceremonies and Mr. N. Kaethler provided vocal selections, accompanied by Rev. E. Schultz.
