# MINUTES - 1992 ANNUAL MEETING WOMEN'S AUXILIARY OF WATERLOO LUTHERAN SEMINARY

The Annual Meeting of the Women's Auxiliary of Waterloo Lutheran Seminary was held at St. John Lutheran Church, Waterloo, on Wednesday, September 30, 1992. Registration began at 9:30 a.m. through 10:00 o'clock, coffee and cookies were served during this time in the Fellowship Hall.

President Mrs. Joyce Dietrich called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone present. Seminarian Kevin McLeod was in charge of opening devotions. Hymns number 250 and 460 were sung, and responsive reading was from Psalm 119.

Joyce Dietrich announced that the business session would be conducted in the afternoon and that Dr. Eduard Riegert would speak this morning. The Rev. Linda Thomson brought greetings from St. John Church. Dr. Richard Crossman conveyed his greetings and spoke on behalf of the Seminary.

Mrs. Eileen Dressler introduced Dr. Eduard Riegert who has been with the Seminary as Professor in Homiletics for the past 27 years. Dr. Riegert spoke on the theme "How to listen to a Sermon". He noted that we should prepare ourselves before-hand for the sermon, to pray for the preacher, to read the Scriptures before the service, to listen attentively to what is being presented and to follow through and discuss the sermon with the preacher.

Mrs. Bernice Liddle thanked Dr. Riegert and presented him with an honorarium.

- Dr. Richard Crossman expressed his thanks to the Auxiliary for their service to the Seminary and introduced four of the new students and asked them to address the meeting and give a brief outline of their background.

### President's Report - 1992 -

We began our 1991-1992 duties with a reception for students and Faculty at the Paul Martin Center following the opening chapel service of the Fall semester. Last September we were pleased to use our own silver service for the first time in many years. It enhanced our tea table and it is now housed in the Seminary for its purposes.

Our important event is always the Annual Meeting, a grand ingathering of Lutheran women for a day of sharing and learning. We all enjoy the input of seminarians young and older as we sing together, visit together and of course lunch together, as well as worship together.

Following the Annual Meeting we settle down to our regular duties. We send reports to you of clinical training grants, scholarships, and ordination gift certificates for students. We decide what projects we will undertake during the year.

This past year, Pastor Ab Lorch completed the restoration of the original chapel altar in Willison Hall. It is now in place in the Bell Tower chapel room.

Dr. Carol Schlueter has come to us with an exciting plan to organize a networking group for professional women in the Ministry and Pastoral Care. We have been impressed with the high calibre of women entering the field and would like to offer them our support.

Finally, Reverend Paul Bosch would like to have kneeling cushions for the marble floor of the altar area in the chapel, for use at communion. He envisages needlepoint cushions that would add to the beauty of the Liturgy.

Initially we thought this an ambitous project, but as we consulted with the noted artist Nancy Lou Patterson and with each other we came to the conclusion that this could be a worthy gift to the Seminary on the occasion of our 80th Anniversary next year. Pastor Paul and Nancy Lou will tell you more about this later this morning. The executive committee has decided that if we donate our special collection to it this year and next it will cover our costs. I hope you will support this project.

Thank you, women of the church, for the quilts, they are beautiful as always.

Special thanks to Mrs. Dorothy Schaefer for all the work she has done for us during many years of devoted service.

Afternoon Session - Mrs. Marion Tannassee introduced the Guest Speaker Dr. Carol Schlueter, Professor in New Testament Theology, Waterloo Lutheran Seminary. She spoke on the subject of Women's Spirituality. As Christians it is for us to choose whether we are to be a homemaker or a professor, using our homemaking skills in the field of theology. Homemaking is not merely the handling of everyday affairs, but it is the running of a household, the building and strengthening of family life, and having compassion in all our activites.

Mrs. Margaret Ludolph thanked the speaker, acknowledging our appreciation, and presented Dr. Schlueter with an honorarium.

## New Business -

Pastor Paul Bosch spoke on the topic of kneelers for the Seminary Chapel. He introduced Nancy Lou Patterson who is designing the project and drew attention to the work she has already done in this area, includin the hanging on the altar to be seen to-day in St. John Lutheran Church.

We are indeed fortunate to have an artist who is so talented and committed to her work. This project will involve considerable expense as well as time and work by the congregations. The cost of the kneelers would be spread over more than one year but it would be more than worth-while after it is completed.

Nancy Lou Patterson gave a presentation on the project which shows the kneelers as they would appear in the Seminary Chapel. Two full chart have been made indicating that there would be 12 cushions and 2 loose pillows. The design is based on the Creation, divided into Winter, Spring Summer and Fall. The size of the kneelers would be about 30 x 12". It is hoped that the ladies of the various churches would do the embroidery
