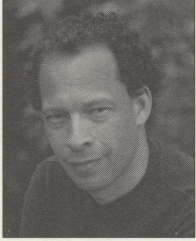

Lawrence Hill

It is with deep gratitude that Wilfrid Laurier University honours Lawrence Hill in recognition of his significant contributions to Canadian literature and his outstanding talent as an internationally acclaimed writer. He has been a distinguished visitor at literary events hosted by the University and other venues in the Kitchener-Waterloo community over the last decade. Mr. Hill is a "writer's writer" whose works in several genres include novels, essays and memoir. His novels include *Any Known Blood*, *Some Great Thing* and *The Book of Negroes*. He won the National Magazine Award for best essay published in Canada in 2005 for "Is Africa's Pain Black America's Burden?" He is also the writer of the award-winning documentary film, *Seeking Salvation: A History of the Black Church in Canada*. His most recent non-fiction work is Joshua Key's memoir, *The Deserter's Tale*, which he helped craft.

His third novel, the critically acclaimed best-seller, *The Book of Negroes*, was published as *Someone Knows My Name* in the United States, Australia and New Zealand. The book has garnered several prestigious literary prizes including regional and overall Commonwealth Writers' Prize for Best Book. It also won the Roger's Writers' Trust Fiction Prize, the Ontario Library's Associations Evergreen Award and the 2009 CBC Radio Canada Reads Award. It was a finalist for the Hurston/Wright LEGACY Award and longlisted for both the Giller and the IMPAC Award.

Mr. Hill was educated in Canada and the United States. He holds a BA in economics from Laval University and an MA in writing from the Johns Hopkins University. A former journalist, he was a reporter for the *Toronto Globe and Mail* and served as parliamentary correspondent for the *Winnipeg Free Press*. Although his published works are in English, Mr. Hill is also fluent in French and Spanish and has lived and worked across Canada, in Baltimore in the U.S., and in France and Spain. His voluntary work with Canadian Crossroads International took him to the Francophone African countries of Mali, Niger and Cameroon.

Born to activist parents, Daniel and Donna Hill, in Toronto in 1957, Lawrence Hill, along with his two siblings, grew up with a strong sense of the importance of civic engagement and community involvement through their parents' extensive work for human rights. His father, Dr. Daniel G. Hill, was the first director and later chairman of the Ontario Human Rights Commission who later served as ombudsman for the province of Ontario. Lawrence Hill's book, *Black Berry, Sweet Juice: Being Black and White in Canada* includes reflections on issues of race, culture and identity spurred by recollections of his growing up in an interracial family in Toronto.

A common theme running through Mr. Hill's works is the linked search for identity, belonging and place. Explored in his earlier novels and non-fiction writing, these themes are brought together, poignantly, in the tale of Aminata, the young girl whose experiences of slavery and triumph are at the heart of *The Book of Negroes*. The novel's name is drawn from a 1783 historical document. In the novel, the transnational connections between Africa, the Americas and western Europe are explored. Though this is territory explored by academicians, the significance of the novel is its elucidation of these connections in a compelling narrative that has captured the imagination of readers, internationally.

Conferring an honorary doctorate is a fitting way of celebrating the contributions of this most generous and distinguished writer.

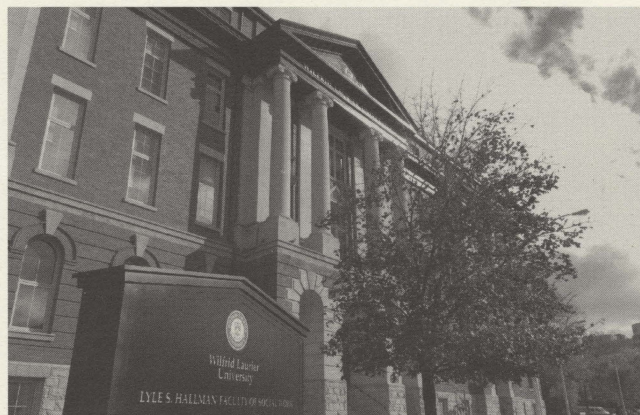

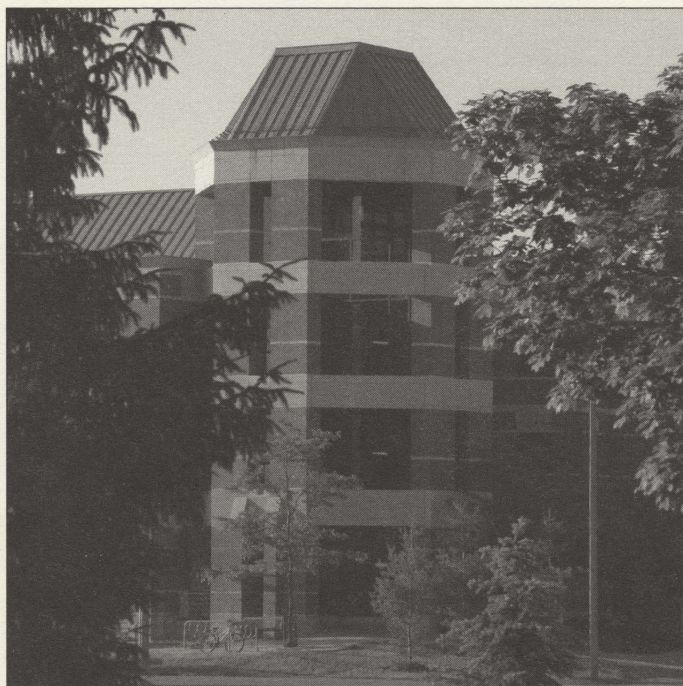

Gerard McGrath has spent the greater part of his life working in debt and equity investment management: with Cavendish Investing, as a founding shareholder and chief financial officer at Dynamic Capital Corporation/Dundee Bancorp, as CFO at Penfund, CFO at Borealis Capital, and as partner and CFO at Perseis Partners. Today we honour Mr. McGrath for the investment he has made in Laurier.

Mr. McGrath's daughter, Susan, was a high-achieving business student at Laurier. She graduated and took up a successful career in Toronto. Fortunately for us, her father stayed.

Mr. McGrath became a member of Laurier's Board of Governors, assuming quite naturally the role of treasurer. But his involvement in the MBA program came about by accident. In 2004, he was looking for a speaker for the company conference when Susan suggested he ask one of her former professors. At the conference, we told Mr. McGrath about our Integrated Case Exercise (ICE), a week-long event in which students study a Canadian company and propose solutions to current problems. Our problem was finding companies that were willing to provide access to "live" data — business plans, competitor information and, if we were lucky, detailed financials. Mr. McGrath said, "Good idea" — and immediately made ICE his own. Our students have been working with Perseis Partners portfolio companies ever since.

Working with Mr. McGrath has inspired faculty to continually set higher standards, especially for the integrative projects that make SBE distinctive. His deep knowledge, his insight, and his wealth of experience challenge us and keep us focused. Exposure to his approach and to his company's investment and management practices is revelatory for our students. Mr. McGrath's generosity is boundless, not just in financial terms, but in the time he gives and in giving so much of himself. He has given us the ability to experiment, to innovate, and to keep our programs relevant.

Mr. McGrath made it possible for us to create Laurier's Centre for Excellence in Business Education (CEBE) in 2008. His continued support has enabled CEBE to, among other initiatives, bring in world-class speakers, launch the RIM-Rogers MBA BlackBerry Pilot, and start the design work for an International BBA degree and a new, Global Hybrid MBA.

Mr. McGrath has been pivotal in our efforts to recruit women to the MBA. With her father's support, Susan McGrath has facilitated yearly sessions at Verity, the fastest-growing club in Toronto. It's one of our most successful recruiting events, providing opportunities for women while at the same time improving our Toronto profile with an important and influential audience.

Mr. McGrath has supported not only SBE, but Laurier's library, the Maureen Forrester Music Collection, Accessible Learning, the Art Gallery — the list goes on and on. He never forgets, and doesn't let us forget, that money, career, financial success — none of these are ends in themselves. Ultimately, it's his quiet insistence on what *really* matters that has made Laurier a better place for teaching and learning. Mr. McGrath is a part of Laurier, and we'll never let him go. And so he will assume his rightful place as the first-ever recipient of the Order of Wilfrid Laurier University.

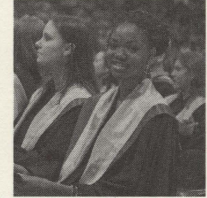

THE CEREMONY

Convocation Traditions

Convocation is the most solemn ceremony within the university community. Since their beginnings in the Middle Ages, universities have performed this ceremony in order to grant degrees to their students and also to welcome those students into the community of scholars which has trained them.

The conferring of the degree is symbolized either by an acknowledgement or handshake from the Chancellor or the President or other conferring officers of the university.

As an outward sign of his or her new state, the student wears a hood. Each degree within a university has a hood of unique colours and trim in order that the student's status may be recognized—indeed every university guards its own set of hoods from use by any other university.

In order to recognize the nature of this event for the students involved, the university asks that parents and friends of the students participating in this ceremony withhold their applause until all members being admitted to each degree have left the dais. Students are asked to remain in their seats while other graduates receive their degrees.

The Academic Degrees

The academic degree is a title conferred on an individual by a university as recognition of the completion of a course of study or for a certain attainment. In Canada, the three stages in higher education are represented by the degrees of bachelor, master and doctor. Wilfrid Laurier University is given the authority to grant degrees by the Wilfrid Laurier University Act.

The bachelor's degree is awarded at the honours and general level. An honours degree program emphasizes the acquisition of a broad and deep knowledge of the student's chosen honours subject, including both skill at applying the subject and appreciation of its relation to general knowledge and society. A general degree program emphasizes a balance between an in-depth understanding of the student's major subject and a knowledge and appreciation of other fields. Completion of an honours degree normally takes four years and a general degree, three years.

The master's degree is the second degree in higher education. Students complete concentrated and specialized work at a more advanced level in an academic discipline or professional area. Most course work is within the field of specialization and a research project or thesis is normally required. Some master's degrees provide professional qualifications. The master's degree usually requires one or two years of study after a bachelor's degree.

The doctoral degree is the highest academic degree granted by a university. Candidates for the degree spend several years in the advanced study of a specialized field of knowledge. The capstone of the degree is the doctoral dissertation, an extended work based upon independent research. The dissertation demonstrates the candidate's command of both the subject matter and the exacting methods of scholarship, and makes an original contribution to knowledge.

Honorary Degrees

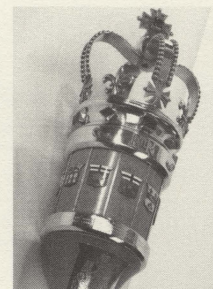
Honorary degrees are conferred by Wilfrid Laurier University in recognition of outstanding scholarly, creative, or professional achievement or distinguished public and community service. The university may grant the following honorary degrees: Doctor of Laws (LLD), Doctor of Letters (DLitt), Doctor of Science (DSc) and Doctor of Divinity (DDiv).

Wilfrid Laurier University Mace

The mace of Wilfrid Laurier University was officially presented by the Euler family at the 1963 fall convocation in memory of The Honourable W.D. Euler, former senator of Canada and the first chancellor of the university. It weighs 16 pounds and was manufactured by the firm of Henry Birks Limited, Montreal.

The ferrule near the base of the shaft contains ivory from a walrus tusk obtained from Coral Harbour, Northwest Territories. The ten-sided shaft, representing the ten provinces, merges into the head of the mace which bears the ten provincial crests. The wood used at the point where the shaft meets the head of the mace is elm taken from the bannister post of Conrad Hall, the original seminary building. Above this are four crests relating to the history of the institution: a crest of Waterloo County, the Luther Coat of Arms, the crest of the Waterloo Lutheran Seminary and the coat of arms of the University of Western Ontario.

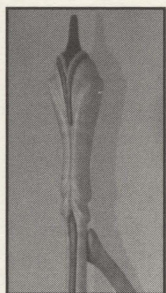
The head of the mace is made of maple and bears the Federal Coat of Arms, above which is the monogram of Queen Elizabeth II, during whose reign the university's charter was granted. On the reverse side is the crest of Wilfrid Laurier University and the monogram of King George V, during whose reign the original charter was granted. The top of the mace is a crown, mounted with jewels, symbolizing the authority of the State.

The Marshal's Baton

Dr. Fred Binding, a faculty member in the Department of Psychology for 32 years retired in July 2003. He had served as the university marshal for ten years. Sadly, Dr. Binding died in August 2003. In memory of his contribution to convocation ceremonies, artist Rex Lingwood was commissioned to create a marshal's baton.

In the baton, the artist incorporates a range of visual references that relate to the graduation ceremony, both directly and symbolically. In keeping with the nature of the ceremony, some of the forms are traditionally associated with ceremonial staffs, and the baton's design echoes the elaborate theatricality of the event and the flair brought to the occasion by Dr. Fred Binding. The ends may be read as abstracted figure forms wrapped in the academic gown and hood, with details in the university colours: purple and gold. These forms also read as plant buds, symbolizing the life stage of the graduates. The Greek alphabet is inset into an internal side surface in the shaft of the baton. This is a reference to the interests of Dr. Fred Binding. It also acknowledges that language is at the core of university education and that the Greek language has particular importance in western culture.

The commission of the baton was made possible with the generous support of the Department of Psychology and Wilfrid Laurier University Retirees' Association.

Wilfrid Laurier University Alumni Association

More than 70,000 graduates of Wilfrid Laurier University and its predecessors are the members of the Wilfrid Laurier University Alumni Association (WLUA). The WLUA, a volunteer driven, non-profit organization, is the official body representing Laurier alumni.
