James Kenneth Campbell



Today we celebrate the achievements of James Campbell, clarinetist, teacher, and artistic director.

Born in Leduc, Alberta in 1949, Mr. Campbell studied at the University of Toronto, Music Academy of the West, Santa Barbara, and in Paris.

During the early part of his career, he won the CBC Talent Festival and the Jeunesses Musicales International Clarinet Competition in Yugoslavia.

Since these early successes, Mr. Campbell has performed in over 30 countries and with over 60 orchestras, including the London Symphony, Orchestre Symphonique de Montréal, and the Boston Pops.

He has collaborated and performed with many of the world's great musicians, including Aaron Copland, the late Glenn Gould, as well as the legendary Amadeus and Guarneri String Quartets.

Mr. Campbell has more than 40 recordings, earning him a Juno Award, a Roy Thomson Hall Award, Canada's Artist of the Year, the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal and the Order of Canada.

His recording of the Brahms Clarinet Quintet was voted "Top Choice" by the BBC and hailed in the London Financial Times thus: "Campbell's opening phrase, a whole Romantic dream in one breath, promises poignant delights, and the entire performance fulfills the promise. In its exquisite twilight vein, it has no competitors."

Mr. Campbell's excellence as a performer transfers equally in the fields of pedagogy and artistic administration. Formerly a faculty member of the University of Toronto, James Campbell has been Professor of Music at the Jacobs School of Music, Indiana University (Bloomington) since 1989.

His students know him to be a remarkably generous and empathetic teacher, a supreme artist, risk taker, and career innovator.

Since 1984, Mr. Campbell has been building the Festival of the Sound in Parry Sound, Ontario in

his role as artistic director. Under his leadership, the festival has become one of the most renowned international summer music festivals in North America, known for high artistic quality and diversity, solid marketing and finances, and a loyal and ever-growing audience base.

Mr. Campbell is a calm and focused leader with a genuine ability to empower all those around him. He leads with serenity, fairness, passion and humility. His extraordinary ability to galvanize the efforts of many people is exemplified most remarkably in the 2003 building of the \$12-million, 500-seat Stockey Centre for the Performing Arts in Parry Sound. This outstanding achievement alone has enriched summer-life for many in Ontario, with an international arts venue to be shared for generations to come.

James Campbell is a trusted friend and loyal colleague to many in the Kitchener-Waterloo music community. In the past three decades, he has performed numerous times as a soloist with the KW Symphony Orchestra and the KW Chamber Music Society. In February 2009, he was the Laurier Faculty of Music's MWM Financial Group Distinguished Visiting Artist.

When asked what motivates him, Mr. Campbell replies, "Everything we do as artists and administrators, and all that we are, comes down to that moment in a concert when, through sound, a soul is enriched and life is made better."

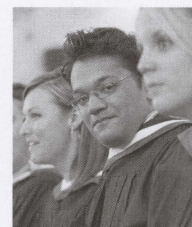

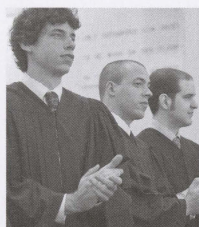

Margaret E. McCully



It is my pleasure today to honor Dr. Margaret McCully for her lifetime career in teaching, research and scholarship, during which she has published over 200 scientific articles and contributed to several books.

She has been a pioneer in studying organisms in their natural environment and has encouraged many plant physiologists to study plant roots and their close surroundings. She is recognized today as one of the best microscopists worldwide; she has published, with Dr. O'Brien, one of the most useful books on plant structure; and she has received many awards. Three of which are: her election as a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada in 1987; her receipt of the Lawson Medal from the Canadian Botanical Association in 1996; and her recognition at the International Botanical Congress in St. Louis in 1999 for her contributions to root biology.

After receiving a B.Sc. in Agriculture from the Ontario Agricultural College (OAC), Margaret McCully taught Biology for two years in Shelburne, Ontario. She then returned to the OAC to complete her master's degree in 1960 before teaching Biology at an all-girls school in England. She later obtained a teaching job at Harvard where she completed her PhD in 1966.

On her return to Canada, Dr. McCully settled in Ottawa, at Carleton University, where she taught and did research for approximately 35 years. On her retirement, she began a new life in Australia where she has been working for the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organization in close contact with Australian farmers. Since she left Canada, we have not seen her often enough but she comes back regularly to St. Mary's, where she was born. In fact, she grew up on a farm where animals were roaming the hills; corn, pumpkins and other vegetables were harvested; and maple sap was flowing in

the spring. Her father, Norman McCully, neither a scientist nor a teacher, taught her to think outside the box; he was knowledgeable in animal husbandry and ahead of others, and he developed artificial insemination in dairy cattle. He also established the Ontario popular breed of Suffolk sheep.

Margaret McCully has trained many students; in fact, she was my PhD supervisor and I can tell you from experience that she has always taken a genuine interest in "educating" her students in the broadest sense. Working in Dr. McCully's lab, we learnt not only plant biology and microscopy, but also art and literature, classical music, and natural science. She helped many students on their way to success as she encouraged them to attend and participate at conferences and workshops. She was an early advocate of networking and she devoted much time and effort to ensure that her students were introduced to highly regarded scientists.

Her geographical meanderings, diverse research experience, knowledge of the literature, and her inquisitive mind give her the ability to make connections and ask questions which do not seem to have occurred to many of us. She has a holistic approach to her studies, and she encourages plant scientists to come out of the lab, to see the entire organism and where it lives. In fact she has been doing what we now call integrative biology before it became fashionable. Thus, I like to think that her ideals will motivate on the students in our new integrative biology program here at Laurier.

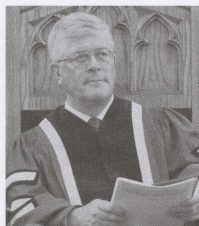

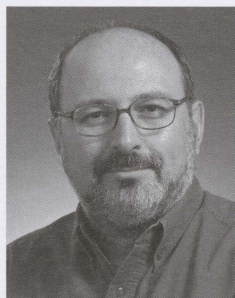

Today we have the privilege of honouring Dr. Panos M. Pardalos, an internationally renowned expert in computing, systems-design engineering, and global and combinatorial optimization. His research has influenced a broad spectrum of subject areas, from network design and information theory to telecommunications, e-commerce and biomedical applications.

Born in Greece, Dr. Pardalos earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics from Athens University, a Master of Science degree in Mathematics and Computer Science from Clarkson University in Potsdam, New York, and a PhD in Computer and Information Sciences from the University of Minnesota.

Dr. Pardalos currently serves as Distinguished Professor of Industrial and Systems Engineering at the University of Florida, where he holds a Research Foundation Professorship and is Director of the Center for Applied Optimization. He is also an affiliated faculty member of the University of Florida's Computer and Information Science Department, Engineering Department, Biomedical Engineering Department, McKnight Brain Institute, the Genetics Institute, and the Hellenic Studies Center. As well, he is a Scientific Advisor to the Laboratory of Algorithms and Technologies for Network Analysis at the Higher School of Economics, Moscow, Russia.

Dr. Pardalos has a wide variety of research interests and is active in numerous research journals and organizations. He is the editor-in-chief of the *Journal of Global Optimization* and the *Journal of Optimization Letters*; co-editor-in-chief of *Computational Management Science*; and associate editor of numerous other journals. In addition, he is a member of the editorial board of several international journals, and the managing editor of several book series. In 2010, he was named President of the International Society of Global Optimization. He is the author

of 10 books and the editor of several more. He has published more than 400 papers and he is a highly cited researcher.

Dr. Pardalos has held visiting appointments at numerous institutions, including Princeton University, the Center for Discrete Mathematics and Theoretical Computer Sciences, Institute of Mathematics and Applications, the Fields Institute for Research in Mathematical Sciences, the AT&T Labs Research, University of Trier in Germany, and the Linköping Institute of Technology in Sweden.

Dr. Pardalos has also received numerous awards and honours. He is a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, a Fellow of the Institute for Operations Research and the Management Sciences, a Foreign Member of the Royal Academy of Doctors in Spain, a Foreign Member of the Lithuanian Academy of Sciences, a Foreign Member of the Ukrainian Academy of Sciences, a Foreign Member of the Petrovskaya Academy of Sciences and Arts in Russia, and Honorary Member of the Mongolian Academy of Sciences. In 2001, Dr. Pardalos was awarded the Greek National Award and Gold Medal for Operations Research.

It is with great admiration and pride that we celebrate the many achievements of Dr. Panos Pardalos today by conferring upon him an Honorary Doctorate of Science.

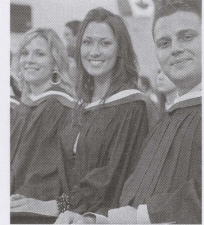

Dionne Brand



Today Wilfrid Laurier University gathers to honour Dionne Brand, poet, novelist, essayist, activist, and filmmaker. She is the author of 18 books and editor of several more anthologies: a prolific writer whose work is renowned for the beauty of its language and for its intense engagement with issues of social justice, most especially concerning racism and global politics made immediate through local contexts. She has also directed four documentary films about the lives of Black women in the diaspora, and narrated three more films concerning Arab feminists and the lives of undocumented workers.

Ms. Brand was educated at the University of Toronto, where she earned a BA in English and Philosophy and an MA in the Philosophy of Education at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education. She has taught literature and creative writing at universities in both British Columbia and Ontario, and at the Banff Centre for Fine Arts in Alberta. She has been Distinguished Visiting Professor at St. Lawrence University in New York, and has held the Ruth Wynn Woodward Chair in Women's Studies at Simon Fraser University and the Ralph Gustafson Poetry Chair at Vancouver Island University. She currently holds a University Research Chair in the University of Guelph's School of English and Theatre Studies, and in 2009 she was appointed as the Poet Laureate of the City of Toronto.

Coming to literary prominence first as a poet, Ms. Brand won the Governor General's Literary Award and Ontario's Trillium Book Prize in 1997 for her volume *Land to Light On*. She garnered two other nominations for the Governor General's Literary Award for her poetry books *No Language Is Neutral* and *Inventory*, and won the Pat Lowther Award, awarded by the League of Canadian Poets, for her book *thirsty* in 2002, a year that also saw *thirsty* nominated for the Griffin Poetry Prize and the City of Toronto Book Award. In other genres,

Ms. Brand's work is equally acclaimed. Her fiction includes the novel *In Another Place, Not Here* which was a New York Times notable book in 1998, and *At the Full and Change of the Moon* which was a Los Angeles Times Notable Book of the Year in 1999. *What We All Long For*, her novel of four young people in Toronto, offers an indelible portrait of the multicultural city and has been translated into Italian, French and German, and won the City of Toronto Book Award in 2006. Her non-fiction includes *Bread Out Of Stone* and *A Map to the Door of No Return*. In 2010, Ms. Brand was awarded one of Canada's most prestigious literary awards, the Griffin Poetry Prize, for her book *Ossuaries*.

In her Ralph Gustafson Lecture at Vancouver Island University in 2006, Ms. Brand noted: "poetry is some kind of perfect speech, some way at getting at the core of things, their true meanings: some honest submission to life." Dionne Brand's commitment to social justice, and to literature as an examination of that struggle for social justice, is exemplary of Laurier's commitment to highlighting the ways that words work to question our histories and to underscore our frailties and our courage.

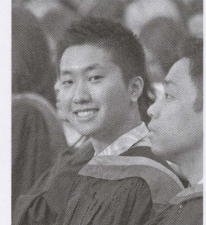

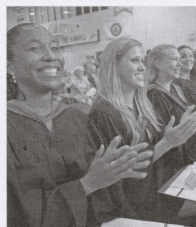

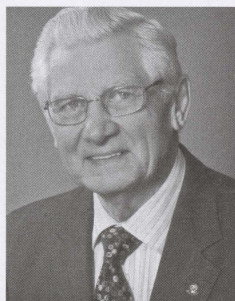

Herb Epp



Herb Epp spent more than 24 years serving the people of Waterloo as an elected official. His undergraduate years at Waterloo College (now Wilfrid Laurier University) in political science and history provided a preamble to what would become a prolific career in politics. Today we honour Mr. Epp for his exemplary record of service to the City of Waterloo, the Region of Waterloo, and to his commitment and contribution to Laurier as a student and an alumnus.

Mr. Epp was born in Winnipeg, Manitoba in 1934. He was one of six sons born to a carpenter and a person who has been described as an “entrepreneurial spirited” mother. His family moved to Ontario when he was seven. After completing high school, he moved to Waterloo in 1958 to accept an offer at Waterloo College, where he completed his bachelor’s degree in political science and history. He later earned a master’s degree in education from the University of Toronto in 1972.

While Mr. Epp was exposed to politics at an early age as he accompanied his father to political meetings, his political activism began at Laurier when he was elected President of the Politics Club in 1959, the first-ever non-partisan political club on campus. As a member of the club, he was instrumental in introducing partisan clubs on campus in 1960. Following the approval of these clubs by the student body, he served as President of the Liberal Club from 1960 to 1961. He was also President of the Canadian University Liberal Federation, foremost among all student Liberal clubs in Canada.

Mr. Epp’s dedication to Laurier continued after his graduation in 1961. He was the president of the WLU Alumni Association from 1966 to 1967. From 1973 to 1974, and again from 2003 to 2006, he was a member of the Board of Governors, serving on the audit committee during the latter term.

Mr. Epp’s long tenure as an elected politician was grounded on a platform of “transparency, accountability and integrity”. He served as

councillor in the City of Waterloo from 1968 to 1974. Ambition and the desire to effect further change led him to run for Mayor of Waterloo in 1974. His victory resulted in two terms as Mayor from 1974 to 1977.

But his desire to serve took him to even greater heights in 1977 when he was elected as Waterloo’s Member of Provincial Parliament. He served four terms in this role, retiring in 1990.

Mr. Epp’s 12th electoral victory brought him back to the Mayor’s office in Waterloo in 2003, where he served one last term.

Mr. Epp’s life was not all politics. He spent 15 years as a local guidance counselor and history teacher, he was a real estate broker, and he served on many community boards, including the Catholic Family Counselling Centre, Family and Children’s Services, the Canadian Institute of International Affairs, and the Kitchener-Westmount Rotary Club. He is currently Chair of the Canadian Land Mine Foundation.

We are here today to celebrate Herb Epp’s many contributions to his community and especially to Wilfrid Laurier University. It is most fitting and deserving that we bestow upon him the Order of Wilfrid Laurier University.

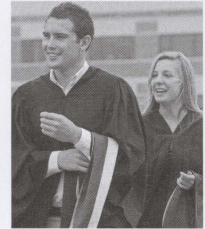

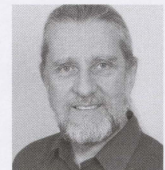

Beverly Harris is a great friend of and contributor to Laurier and a very worthy inductee into the Order of Wilfrid Laurier University.

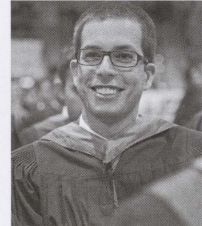

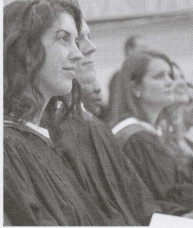

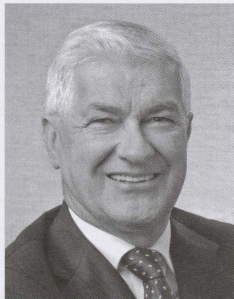

It is with great pleasure that Wilfrid Laurier University honours Réal “Ray” Tanguay in recognition of his significant contributions to the Canadian manufacturing industry, as a philanthropist, and as an acknowledged business leader known for his integrity, discipline, and vision.

Born in Kapuskasing, Ontario, Mr. Tanguay is a graduate of St. Clair College in electrical engineering technology and a proud Wilfrid Laurier University alumnus ('83) in business management. He joined Toyota Motor Manufacturing Canada (TMMC) in 1991, leaving his executive position with Philips Electronics Ltd. He ran Toyota's assembly operations in Cambridge and Woodstock, Ontario, and gained status as a rising corporate star with increasing responsibility beyond Canada.

Mr. Tanguay has held various executive positions with TMMC, including vice-president of manufacturing, engineering, production control in 1993; senior vice-president of administration in 2000; the first Canadian president of Toyota Motor Manufacturing Canada in 2002; and, most recently, chairman.

While managing his duties as chairman of TMMC, in June 2005 Mr. Tanguay was also made a managing officer of Toyota Motor Corporation, a senior vice-president of Toyota Motor North America Inc., and an executive vice-president of Toyota Motor Engineering & Manufacturing North America, Inc. Most recently Mr. Tanguay was announced as senior managing officer of Toyota Motor Corporation, the highest non-Japanese position in the parent company. He is the first Canadian to ever hold this position.

Heading a staff of over 7,000, Toyota sells more Canadian-built vehicles in Canada than any other company. It does business with 78 suppliers in Canada, supporting thousands of additional jobs for Canadians, and it exports 75 per cent of its Canadian-made vehicles, contributing significantly to Canada's balance of trade.

Mr. Tanguay is regarded as a leading force in instilling innovation within the organization. Under his leadership, TMMC became the first plant outside Japan to produce Lexus vehicles, and has won numerous J.D. Power plant-quality awards, while also being recognized for innovation by the Smithsonian Institute.

An admirer of the Lexus slogan, “Passionate Pursuit of Perfection,” Mr. Tanguay believes that you should aim to do and be the best you can be. He has taken this to heart at Toyota and led a group to develop a new corporate strategy called Global Vision. This strategy foresees Toyota doubling its operating profit in 2015 to \$12.2 billion, increasing annual global sales of Toyota and Lexus vehicles to nine million, and moving aggressively into emerging markets such as China, India, Brazil, and Russia.

Mr. Tanguay also brings the passionate pursuit of perfection to his personal life. As a recognized leader in the Canadian economy, Mr. Tanguay co-chaired the Ontario Economic Summit in 2010, and has been a member of Laurier's School of Business & Economics' Dean's Advisory Council for the last eight years, providing advice and guidance to the faculty. He has also brought his philanthropic spirit to Toyota where they have become loyal supporters of numerous local and national charities in the areas of the environment, health, and education.

Mr. Tanguay often refers to the saying “if you think you can't, you won't. If you think you can, you will. We can, we will.” Each day he shows this passion for excellence, and Laurier is proud to be associated with him. Mr. Tanguay exemplifies the qualities and characteristics of leadership and management excellence that we seek to develop in our students at Laurier, and he embodies the essence of what it means to live a life of leadership and purpose.

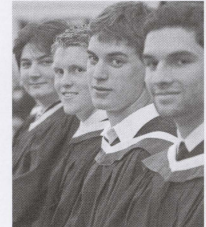

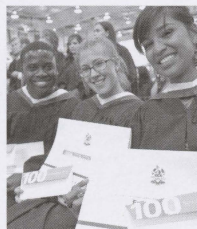

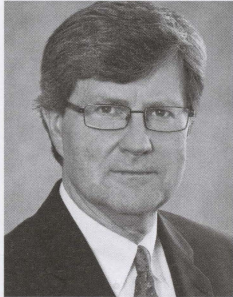

Sean Conway



Today we honour Sean Conway, a Laurier man of long standing. As an undergraduate here in the early 1970s, Mr. Conway astonished his professors and classmates with his encyclopedic knowledge of Canadian history and politics. Thirty years later, he returned for a second tour of duty, as a professor, teaching Ontario politics to third-year Laurier students. His lectures are still remembered for their depth of political knowledge and insider's grasp of legislative tradition and practice.

Mr. Conway was certainly not idle in the decades between his two incarnations at Laurier. After graduating, he went to Queen's University for his MA. He was preparing to move on to a doctorate at Duke University in North Carolina when Conservative Premier William Davis called a provincial election in 1975. Mr. Conway was, and is, an Ottawa Valley boy. His grandfather, Thomas Patrick Murray, had been the Liberal member for Renfrew South in the Ontario Legislature and young Sean absorbed the lore and arcana of politics by accompanying his grandfather to countless political meetings. He loved those gatherings with their fiery debates, wit and passion, in the fine Irish tradition of "Valley" politics. While still a teenager, Mr. Conway, as he puts it, "succumbed to the magnetic appeal of politics."

Local Liberals knew him well. When the election was called in 1975, they urged him to run in the riding of Renfrew North. He won and, at the age of 24, became the youngest member of the Ontario Legislature. When he retired in 2003, he was the longest-serving member of the Assembly. In the intervening 28 years, he was never far from the centre of the political action. He was one the architects of the 1985 Liberal-NDP accord that ended 42 unbroken years of Tory rule. When David Peterson became premier of a minority Liberal government, he appointed Mr. Conway minister of education and, later, minister of colleges and universities, minister of skills development, government house leader and minister of mines. One of Mr. Conway's first, and most controversial, duties was to bring in legislation honouring a

Davis government commitment to extend full public funding to Ontario's separate schools. In those early years, the Liberal government was run by a high-powered quartet they called the "Four Horsemen" – Premier Peterson, former leader Bob Nixon, attorney general Ian Scott, and Sean Conway. Mr. Conway was a star in the House, recognized for his sense of history, his eloquence and his wicked sense of humour. He commanded respect. Many of his political opponents became good, personal friends.

In 1990, Premier Peterson called a snap election. He lost that gamble. Bob Rae and the NDP came to power, but Sean Conway kept getting elected. He declined to seek the Liberal leadership in 1997, the year Dalton McGuinty won it. From 1997 to 2003, Mr. Conway commuted from his home in the Ottawa Valley to Queen's Park to sit in opposition to Mike Harris's Conservatives, and to Waterloo to teach at Laurier. Today, he is chair of the board of directors of the Ontario Centres of Excellence, a Toronto-based public-private partnership dedicated to research and innovation.

Mr. Conway's friends describe him as "an academic politician." Had he not succumbed to the "magnetic appeal" of politics back in 1975, he might have collected his PhD from Duke and become a tenured academic. Instead he chose the path of a career politician and quickly established himself as an accomplished parliamentarian. Some of his contemporaries compared him to John Diefenbaker in terms of his forensic skill.

It was only fitting that the Churchill Society, a non-partisan organization that honours Diefenbaker's hero, Winston Churchill, chose Mr. Conway to receive its Award for Excellence in the Cause of Parliamentary Democracy in 2007. Today, in 2012, we welcome our "academic politician" back for his third incarnation at Laurier: this time as Doctor Sean Conway.

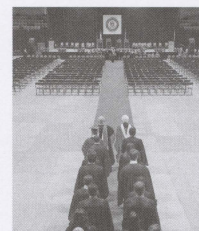

The Ceremony

Convocation is the most solemn ceremony within the university community. Since their beginnings in the Middle Ages, universities have performed this ceremony in order to grant degrees to their students and also to welcome those students into the community of scholars which has trained them.

The conferring of the degree is symbolized either by an acknowledgement or handshake from the Chancellor or the President or other conferring officers of the university.

As an outward sign of his or her new state, the student wears a hood. Each degree within a university has a hood of unique colours and trim in order that the student's status may be recognized—indeed every university guards its own set of hoods from use by any other university.

In order to recognize the nature of this event for the students involved, the university asks that parents and friends of the students participating in this ceremony withhold their applause until all members being admitted to each degree have left the dais. Students are asked to remain in their seats while other graduates receive their degrees.

The Academic Degrees

The academic degree is a title conferred on an individual by a university as recognition of the completion of a course of study or for a certain attainment. In Canada, the three stages in higher education are represented by the degrees of bachelor, master and doctor. Wilfrid Laurier University is given the authority to grant degrees by the Wilfrid Laurier University Act.

The bachelor's degree is awarded at the honours and general level. An honours degree program emphasizes the acquisition of a broad and deep knowledge of the student's chosen honours subject, including both skill at applying the subject and appreciation of its relation to general knowledge and society. A general degree program emphasizes a balance between an in-depth understanding of the student's major subject and a knowledge and appreciation of other fields. Completion of an honours degree normally takes four years and a general degree, three years.

The master's degree is the second degree in higher education. Students complete concentrated and specialized work at a more advanced level in an academic discipline or professional area. Most course work is within the field of specialization and a research project or thesis is normally required. Some master's degrees provide professional qualifications. The master's degree usually requires one or two years of study after a bachelor's degree.

The doctoral degree is the highest academic degree granted by a university. Candidates for the degree spend several years in the advanced study of a specialized field of knowledge. The capstone of the

degree is the doctoral dissertation, an extended work based upon independent research. The dissertation demonstrates the candidate's command of both the subject matter and the exacting methods of scholarship, and makes an original contribution to knowledge.

Honorary Degrees

Honorary degrees are conferred by Wilfrid Laurier University in recognition of outstanding scholarly, creative, or professional achievement or distinguished public and community service. The university may grant the following honorary degrees: Doctor of Laws (LLD), Doctor of Letters (DLitt), Doctor of Science (DSc) and Doctor of Divinity (DDiv).

Wilfrid Laurier University Mace

The mace of Wilfrid Laurier University was officially presented by the Euler family at the 1963 fall convocation in memory of The Honourable W.D. Euler, former senator of Canada and the first chancellor of the university. It weighs 16 pounds and was manufactured by the firm of Henry Birks Limited, Montreal.

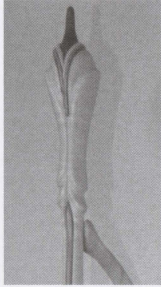
The ferrule near the base of the shaft contains ivory from a walrus tusk obtained from Coral Harbour, Northwest Territories. The ten-sided shaft, representing the ten provinces, merges into the head of the mace which bears the ten provincial crests. The wood used at the point where the shaft meets the head of the mace is elm taken from the bannister post of Conrad Hall, the original seminary building. Above this are four crests relating to the history of the institution: a crest of Waterloo County, the Luther Coat of Arms, the crest of the Waterloo Lutheran Seminary and the coat of arms of the University of Western Ontario.

The head of the mace is made of maple and bears the Federal Coat of Arms, above which is the monogram of Queen Elizabeth II, during whose reign the university's charter was granted. On the reverse side is the crest of Wilfrid Laurier University and the monogram of King George V, during whose reign the original charter was granted. The top of the mace is a crown, mounted with jewels, symbolizing the authority of the State.

The Marshal's Baton

Dr. Fred Binding, a faculty member in the Department of Psychology for 32 years retired in July 2003. He had served as the university marshal for ten years. Sadly, Dr. Binding died in August 2003. In memory of his contribution to convocation ceremonies, artist Rex Lingwood was commissioned to create a marshal's baton.

In the baton, the artist incorporates a range of visual references that relate to the graduation ceremony, both directly and symbolically. In keeping with the nature of the ceremony, some of the forms are traditionally associated with ceremonial staffs, and the baton's design echoes the elaborate theatricality of the event and the flair brought to the occasion by Dr. Fred Binding. The ends may be read as abstracted figure forms wrapped in the academic gown and hood, with details in the university colours: purple and gold. These forms also read as plant buds, symbolizing the life stage of the graduates. The Greek alphabet is inset into an internal side surface in the shaft of the baton. This is a reference to the interests of Dr. Fred Binding. It also acknowledges that language is at the core of university education and that the Greek language has particular importance in western culture.

The commission of the baton was made possible with the generous support of the Department of Psychology and Wilfrid Laurier University Retirees' Association.

Wilfrid Laurier University Alumni Association

Nearly 80,000 graduates of Wilfrid Laurier University and its predecessors are the members of the Wilfrid Laurier University Alumni Association (WLUAA). The WLUAA, a volunteer driven, non-profit organization, is the official body representing Laurier alumni. The elected Board of Directors is representative of all academic faculties and many different decades.

The WLUAA supports Wilfrid Laurier University with revenue from alumni services, such as group home, auto and life insurance, an affinity credit card and financial services. WLUAA revenues help to fund alumni programs, university projects, student groups, scholarships, homecoming and Laurier Campus, the alumni magazine.

To foster alumni interaction with the university and alumni communities; to promote active alumni participation in the affairs of the university; to maintain and promote the reputation of the university and contribute to its ongoing development.
