BRANTFORD – Laurier International will host events in Brantford and Waterloo during global engagement week Feb. 23 to 28. The theme of the week is exploring food, connecting culture. Events include public lectures, human libraries, photo exhibits and film screenings.

"Global Engagement Week provides an opportunity to raise awareness of the diversity within the Laurier community and explore the impacts of globalization through the arts, food, games, training and presentations," said Phyllis Power, global engagement programming manager. "The week's events are organized by student groups, staff, and faculty and we encourage the campuses and the communities to come and learn about global engagement at Laurier."

In Brantford, highlights of the week include:
