I have read, & think only three books on strictly theological lines since I wrote you last. They are Dr. M. Loy's Exposition of the Augsburg Confession, a most excellent work to strengthen one's Lutheranism; Broadus on Preaching, which I think is the most suggestive, helpful and stimulating work I have read along the line of Homiletics; and Vinet's Pastoral Theology. For some time I have been occupying what little spare time I have in reading an informative secular work Greene's History of the English People. When I finish that I will go back to something more nearly along my line. But I have had very little time for reading. After Rev. Murray resigned here I was called to Mohone Bay and entered on the work Oct. 3, '09. My successor at New Germany is the Rev. J. F. Benson of the Seminary at Plattsburgh.
