Grace be to you and peace from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ.

At a meeting of The Board of Governors of The Evangelical Lutheran Seminary of Canada, held on September 11, 1923, you were duly chosen to become Professor in Waterloo College. By authority and on behalf of the said Board a formal call is hereby extended to you and you are earnestly urged to accept the same.

As Professor in Waterloo College you will be required to take charge of the department of Modern Languages--French and German--and teach these languages in accordance with the regulations of the Department of Education for Ontario and the course of studies of Waterloo College. You may also be required from time to time, as may be agreed among the Faculty, to teach certain other subjects that are not provided for in other departments. You will be expected to maintain wholesome discipline, exercise such Christian influence as opportunity may afford and in general cooperate with the Principal and other members of the College Faculty in promoting the best interests of Waterloo College.

In consideration of your services, the Board offers you an initial salary of Fifteen Hundred Dollars (1500), payable in monthly instalments, with annual increases of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) until a maximum of Eighteen Hundred Dollars per annum is reached, together with the free use of a house near the College.

Trusting that you may see divine direction in this call, that you may consider it favourably, and that you may be able to enter upon the duties to which it invites you at a very early date.
