CHOIR TOUR TAKE I

WATERLOO UNIVERSITY COLLEGE CHOIR
GOES ON SIX-DAY TOUR OF PROVINCE

THIRTY YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN FROM FOUR CANADIAN PROVINCES -- ALL STUDENTS OF WATERLOO UNIVERSITY COLLEGE -- WILL GO ON A SIX-DAY CONCERT TOUR, FEBRUARY 16-21. THE SCHEDULE INCLUDES CONCERTS IN SCHOOLS AND CHURCHES IN SIX CITIES. A CONCERT PLANNED FOR PARLIAMENT -- ARRANGED BY LLOYD R. CROUSE, M.P., WAS POSTPONED BECAUSE PARLIAMENT WAS PROROGUED.

THE CHOIR IS DIRECTED BY THE INTERNATIONALLY-KNOWN MUSICIAN, CHARLES S. McCLAIN, WHO BEGAN HIS WORK AT THE UNIVERSITY THIS YEAR.

ONE-HALF OF EACH CONCERT WILL BE GIVEN OVER TO PSALM SETTINGS, FROM GREGORIAN CHANTS TO CONTEMPORARY MOTETS. A GROUP OF SPIRITUALS AND CANADIAN FOLK SONGS AS WELL AS MUSIC FROM MODERN WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE PROGRAM. IT IS THE AIM OF MR. MCCLAIN TO GIVE HIS STUDENTS THE FULL-RANGE OF CHOIR EXPERIENCE AND TO SHARE IT WITH HIS AUDIENCES.

WHILE MANY COLLEGE CHOIRS LIMIT CONCERTS TO A CAPELLA SINGING, MR.

MCCLAIN HAS PREPARED HIS SINGERS TO PRESENT A WIDER VARIETY OF MUSIC.

SPECIAL FEATURES INCLUDE HANDEL'S FLUTE SONATA PLAYED BY DAVID DREW
OF THE WLU FACULTY, FLUTIST; MARTIN LAEHNEMANN, CELLIST, AND MR. MCCLAIN AT
THE HARPSICHORD. THE BUXTEHUDE CONTATE "LAUD HIM, CHRISTIAN," WILL BE PERFORMED BY A SMALL UNIT OF THE CHOIR ACCOMPANIED BY FLUTE, VIOLIN, AND HARPSICHORD.
