NEW GRADUATE PROGRAMS ANNOUNCED

BY WATERLOO LUTHERAN UNIVERSITY

Waterloo Lutheran University will add a graduate program in psychology to its graduate programs this fall. The university already offers post-graduate courses in romance languages and geography.

Dr. Neale H. Tayler, chairman of the university's council of graduate studies, said the new program will lead to a Master of Arts degree in psychology.

Courses will be offered. in research design, psychological theory, learning, perception, industrial psychology, counselling and assessment, and social psychology. Three courses and a thesis will be required for graduation.

"It's not just that we need more psychologists, although we clearly do," said Dr. Clifford Anderson, acting chairman of the university's department of psychology. "But also that we need more psychology.

"A program of graduate studies involves the university in support of research by staff and students, so that besides training individuals in available techniques, the department can play a responsible role in the development of new methods."

Most students will complete the work in a year past an honors degree in arts or in two years after completing a general arts course.

Dr. Teyler added that a Master of Arts program in history will commence in September, 1967.

Waterloo Lutheran University also offers the degree of Bachelor of Divinity and this fall will open a new graduate school of social work, with courses leading to the degree of M.S.W. (master of social work).
