WUC OPENS TWO NEW CENTRES

FOR EXTENSION STUDENTS

Waterloo University College will open extension courses in two new centres this fall, bringing to five the number of outside places served by the college. The two new centres are at Walkerton, which replaces Mount Forest, and Orillia.

Dean of WUC, Rev. Dr. L. H. Schaus, said that classes were being moved from Mount Forest to Walkerton because Walkerton was central for a larger unserved area. Former Mount Forest students will be able to attend lectures in Guelph, he said. Up to 150 people are expected to enrol for the courses at Orillia.

"We expect to serve between 700 and 800 students in extension courses this year," Dean Schaus added.

The following courses will be offered --

Kitchener-Waterloo: Economics 20 (introduction to economics); English 20 (general literature and composition); English 36 (drama); French 20 (advanced French); Geography 44 (urban geography); Geology 20 (introductory geology); History 31 (history of Canada); History 36 (history of modern Europe); Philosophy 30 (basic philosophical literature); Psychology 48 (abnormal psychology); Spanish 20 (advanced Spanish).

Guelph: Economics 20 (introduction to economics); English 38 (literature of Canada and USA); Math 24 (calculus); Psychology 36 (developmental psychology).

Orangeville: Geography 36 (world regional geography); History 31 (history of Canada); Politics 20 (introduction to theory and processes of government); Psychology 20 (introduction to psychology).

Orillia: English 20 (general literature and composition); Philosophy 30 (basic philosophical literature); Psychology 20 (introduction to psychology); Sociology 20 (introduction to sociology).

Walkerton: Geography 20 (introduction to geography); History 36 (history of modern Europe).

All classes will be three hours in length and will be held every second Saturday, beginning September 28. The courses will run for 14 weeks.
