<u>Fisheries and Wildlife Researchers</u>

<u>Presenting Papers at WLU Sessions</u>

Two hundred faculty members and students from universities across Ontario, plus some from Michigan and New York State, begin a two-day session on fisheries and wildlife research today (Friday) at Waterloo Lutheran University.

The sessions are sponsored jointly by WLU and the University of Waterloo, and are supported by a grant from the Ontario government.

Dr. Duncan MacLulich, chairman of WLU's department of biology, will show his film, Searching for the Pine, and also discuss his researches into new methods of making a wildlife census.

Another paper, presented by John Sapwell of the University of Waterloo, discusses the decline of certain fish life in Sunfish Lake, near the Twin Cities.

Most sessions will be conducted at Waterloo Lutheran University but a reception and dinner will be held tonight in the Carnival Room of the Food Services Building, University of Waterloo. The dinner will be followed by showing of a film, Miss Goodall and the Chimpanzees, and a discussion led by primate behaviourists of the University of Waterloo.
