Witches and Slavery Among Topics

At WLU History Conference This Week

More than 50 high school teachers of history in Waterloo County will meet with members of Waterloo Lutheran University's history department Friday and Saturday for a conference on current historical study and research.

The conference was arranged by the WLU history department in cooperation with history department heads throughout the county. Prof. Loren D. Calder of WLU is program chairman.

The opening address on America's Frontier in Canada Since 1945 will be delivered by Dr. Barry M. Gough, of the WLU history department, at an opening dinner Friday at 6:30 p.m. in the Dining Hall Mezzanine of the University. A registration and reception at 5 p.m. at the President's House on Campus will precede the dinner.

Four more speakers, all members of the WLU history department, will deliver papers Saturday morning.

Topics of the Saturday papers and those giving them are Contemporary Evaluations of the Witch Craze, Dr. Arlene Miller-Guinsberg; Interpretations of the French Revolution, Dr. James Harkins: New Directions of the Study of Slavery in the U.S., Dr. William Gleberzon; and the European Community: A Field of Contemporary History, Dr. Peter Stingelin.
