We hopscotched through the decades drawing attention to local topics: the Ferries, the Mountains, the Yacht Clubs, May Day, early Businesses. Streetscapes to name but a few. All were depicted with pictures from our Archives, and from other donors in the community. Artifacts from Bas Collins, Bud Griffiths, and the Archives helped bring the topics to life.
