## A Personal West Van Memory — "The Odeon Movie Club"

As you may have gathered by now, I am endeavouring to encourage people to submit personal memories of a post Lions Gate Bridge West Vancouver. What do you remember of your first encounter with Park Royal, the bowling lanes, the ice rink, elementary/ high school? In this case I would like to remember the favourite haunt of my pre-teen years — the Odeon Movie Club. For me it lasted only from about 1950 to '53, but it was a great three years.
