
## The Rogue Writers and **Ten Years of Tuesdays**

Tuesday evening at seven-thirty for ten years, the Rogue Writers have met half way up Grouse Mountain to read and critique their work, to offer encouragement, and to catch up on what is new in their lives.

According to Rogue member and Tuesday night hostess, Colleen Heinrich (a.k.a. one-eyed woman), the group has gathered for the past ten years to share "Honest opinions on our work, encouragement, criticism, friendship..." and to spend quality time with "...people who will be genuinely happy if you have a writing success."

Gerhard Winkler, the only male Rogue, shares his perspective when he says, "Being surrounded by a bunch of gorgeous females makes my heart feel young."
