Many years ago, 26 to be precise (back in 1980), North Vancouver Community Players left their cozy little 76seat theatre in Hendry Hall on 11th and Hendry to stage a 1730's musical play called Lock Up Your Daughters at Presentation House Theatre. The idea behind this "experiment" was to make the public more of aware of the theatre group and at the same time help promote the newly established Presentation House Theatre. The experiment worked - people came, and it turned out to be one of the highlights of the theatre group's 50-year history.

In May this year, the Players will stage a revival of Lock Up Your Daughters at the same venue. Regrettably, original cast members such as Dennis Mitchell, Glen Greaves and Rob Santo, are no longer with us and Martin Millerchip of the North Shore News is now too old to re-create Constant, the dashingly handsome male romantic lead. But most of the others should just about manage to climb into their Presentation House Theatre seats to enjoy and reminisce. North Van Players' member Dave McIntosh, who played Justice Squeezum in the 1980 production, makes a return appearance, but this time, as the Director.

Lock Up Your Daughters is based on a play by Henry Fielding, the originator of the Tom Jones character and set in licentious London of the 1730's - it is full of deliciously ribald characters who poke fun at themselves and at the established milieu. With a cast of twenty, the show offers a perfect vehicle to demonstrate the strength of community theatre - teamwork, togetherness and hard work, where the only reward is the thrill of treading the boards and entertaining an audience. This musical romp, with lyrics by Lionel Bart and music by Laurie Johnson, was a tremendous hit at the Mermaid Theatre in London fourty years ago and it is still really rollicking good fun today.
