by Aidan Chambers

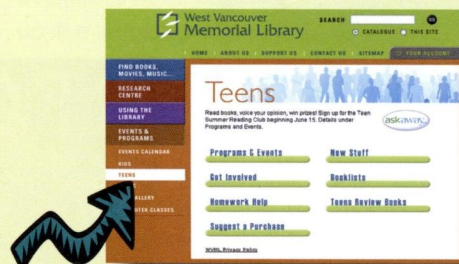
