The smell of onions, fish, or cabbage is quickly removed from pans by the addition of a little vinegar to the water in which they are washed.

cold water and very gentle rubbing will produce a bright polish.

A mixture of soapsuds and turpentine—a gallon of suds to two teaspoonsfuls of turpentine—will brighten a carpet after beating and sweeping in the usual way.

Rub a drop of olive oil on knives and forks that are to be put away and they will retain their brightness and be found free from rust when required
