

## HINTS FOR THE HOME

### Trouble-Saving Ideas

Furniture not provided with castors often scratches polished floors when it is moved about. This can be moved about if little discs of felt are glued to the bottom of the legs of the furniture.

Place lemons that have become dry into a saucpan of hot, not boiling water. Leave the saucpan at the back of the stove for about two hours. Then wipe lemons and they will be found soft and full of juice. Leave until quite cold before using.

If the seat of a cane chair sags and you don't want to buy a new one, wash with cold-water starch to which has been added a good lump of soda. Dry in the sun or before a fire.

Always burn a newspaper in the dustbin when it has been emptied. This keeps it germ-free and sweet.

Do not store cakes and biscuits in the same tin or the biscuits will soon become soft.

If hot-water bottles and other articles made of rubber are washed every two months with water to which a little soda or ammonia has been added, it will prevent them from perishing and getting hard.

A slice of lemon placed in the copper when boiling clothes will remove any stains and make the clothes white.

A boiled potato rubbed on the hands will remove stains, leaving the hands soft and white.

To remove iron rust from a garment spread lemon juice and salt over the stains.

Tarnished silver can be cleaned with a cloth sprinkled with bicarbonate of soda.

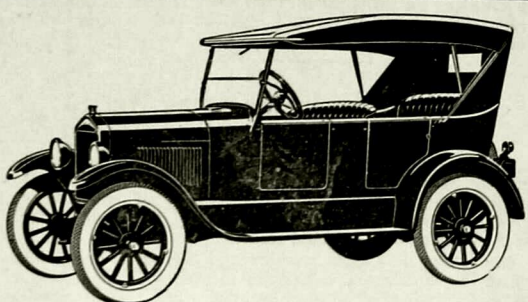
