Rib Roast of Beef

Wipe with a damp cloth and Wipe with a damp cloth and set, skin side down, on a rack in a dripping pan, a rib roast of beef, cut to include the first ribs. (The first five ribs are the most suitable for roasting). Rub over with salt and flour; set in a hot oven to sear over the surface, and baste (dip the melted fat in the pan over the meat) every ten minutes. Reduce the heat after twenty minutes and let cook for an hour and a half let cook for an hour and a half to three-quarters, as a rare, medium or well-done piece of meat is desired. Turn the meat when half cooked, so that the skin side may be properly browned. With roasted beef the rule is high. heat at first to sear over the outside and keep in the juices, then low heat, till the cooking is com-pleted fully.


