TAX REGULATIONS

All persons residing, employed or carrying on business in Canada are liable to tax on income. Returns should be filed by every person who had an income during 1927 in excess of \$1500, notwithstanding the exemptions to which they are entitled.

Exemptions—(Individuals)

(a) \$3000 in the case of a married person or householder or any other person who has dependent upon him any of the following persons:

1. A parent or guardian. 2. A daughter or sister.

3. A son or brother under 21 years of age or incapable of selfsupport on account of mental or physical infirmity.

Where a husband and wife wife each have separate income in excess of \$1500, then each shall receive, not \$3000 exemption, but \$1500.

(b) \$1500 in the case of all other persons.

(c) \$500 is allowed for each child under 21 years of age who is dependent upon the taxpayer for support.

Rate of Tax

Based upon the amount of income in excess of the exemptions stated above:

On the first \$2000 or any portion thereof, 2 per cent. In excess of \$2000 but not in

excess of \$3000, 3 per cent.

In excess of \$3,000 but not in excess of \$4,000, 4 per cent. Tax increases 1 per cent per

\$1000 up to \$20,000.

For rates above \$20,000, see 'Income Tax Act).

Reduction of 20 per cent, of the tax is allowed on above rates in accordance with amendments to the act.

Amendments to the Act Exemptions (corporations) -

Tax of 8 per cent. upon income exceeding \$2000.

Returns of information to be filed on or before March 31. Forms T. 3-Trustees, execu-

Forms T. 4—Employers' re-

ports of salaries, wages, commissions, etc., paid to employees. Forms T. 5-Corporations and joint stock companies, return of

holders. Returns of income to be filed on or before April 30.

dividends and bonuses to share-

All individuals, other than farmers and ranchers, must use Forms T. 1; farmers and ranchers must use forms T. 1a; corporations and joint stock companies must use Form T. 2.
