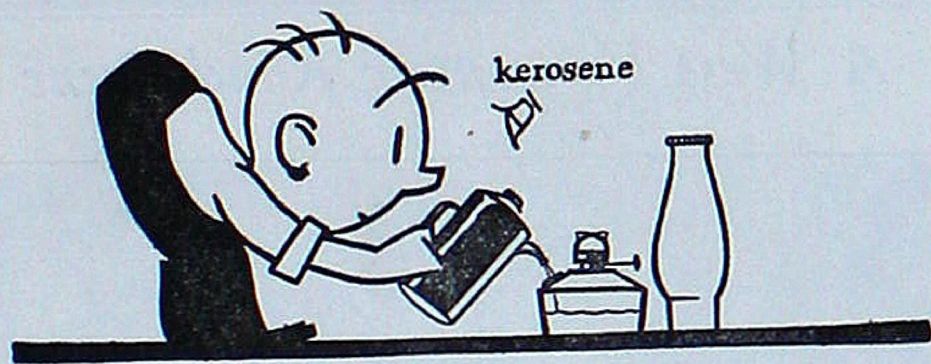

AT the low Vancouver rate electricity costs but 2 cents per k.w.h.—but even if it cost 10 cents, with kerosene at \$1.85 for four gallons—it would be cheaper to light your house electrically.

The cost of electrical service has dropped steadily. In Vancouver the decrease has been 63% since 1917, and the efficiency of service and the quality of lamps is always improving.

Malaga Salad

Dissolve 2 tablespoonfuls of granulated gelatin in 1/2 cupful of cold water. Add 1/4 cupful of sugar and dissolve over hot water; that is, heat a double boiler for about 5 minutes. Cool and add the strained juice of 5 oranges, 2 lemons, and 1 grapefruit. Mix thoroughly, and then pour into individual dampened molds, and when partly set stir in 1 cupful of seeded Malaga grapes. Chill thoroughly and serve with mayonnaise to which a little currant jelly has been added to give a rosy color. This makes a delicious salad. The grapes are tart and the flavor is excellent with the fruit jelly. Proportions 12, as in all of these recipes. More sugar may be added if a sweeter salad is desired.
