Rhubarb Marmalade

10 lbs. pineapple
10 lbs. rhubarb
15 lbs. sugar.
Slice the pineapples very thin and cut in small pieces, removing core. Add 5 lbs. sugar and simmer slowly until tender. Peel the rhubarb and cut in small pieces, cover with 10 lbs. sugar and leave all night. Next day boil both together for 20 minutes. Bottle and put away for use.

Fruit Salad

2 oranges
3 bananas
1/2 pound malaga grapes
4 slices pineapple, cubed
12 walnuts.
Mix fruit and serve salad dressing to moisten. Mix with whipped cream or fruit salad dressing or salad dressing only. May be served in orange cups.

Waldorf Salad

1 cup cubed apple
1 cup celery
1 cup nut meats
Salad dressing to moisten.
Cut slice from tops of green or red apples; scoop out the inside pulp, leaving just enough to hold the skin in place. Fill the shells with the salad mixture and serve on lettuce leaves. A little salad dressing may be put on top of each.

GENERAL GORDON BAND HERE ON 24th MAY

Following the morning activities the band will be tendered a luncheon in Hollyburn School and will then be conveyed to North Vancouver by local car-owners as the youthful bandsmen are taking part in the program at Mahon Park.

SCHOOL BOARD NOTES

A letter was read from the Canadian Club, advising that the Club was arranging for the presentation to schools of Greater Vancouver of a picture entitled "The Swearing in of the first Governor of the Colony of B. C. at Fort Langley in 1859." The Secretary was directed to express to the Canadian Club the thanks of the Board.

A letter was read from the Department of Education advising that the Department makes a grant of \$580 per annum towards the salary of a full-time dentist and if on part-time, a portion of the annual grant depending on the number of days he is employed each week. It was resolved on motion of Trustees Mr. Smith and Mr. Edington that this letter and other information in regard to dental work be filed for future reference.

A letter was read from Mrs. Knight-Hodge asking for the use of two rooms in the Pauline Johnson School, with piano, for the examinations of the Associated Board to be held some time in June, on a Saturday. It was resolved on motion of Trustees Mrs. Masterman and Mr. Edington that this request be granted.

A letter was read from Principal Brealey, and dealt with as follows:

School bus: Mr. Brealey stated that approximately 58 children were being carried on the school bus and he considered it to be overcrowded. The Secretary was directed to ascertain how many High School pupils were travelling on this bus, and report to the next meeting.

School Sports Day: It was resolved on motion of Trustees Mr. Edington and Mr. Smith that application to hold School Sports Day on Friday, May 23rd, be granted.

Back-Stop: Pauline Johnson School Grounds: It was resolved on motion of Trustees Mrs. Selwood and Mr. Smith that the necessary lumber for this be ordered, and Mr. Condon asked to arrange for its erection.

Mr. Condon waited on the Board and asked permission to hold the Annual Cadet Inspection on May 23rd. It was resolved on motion of Trustees Mr. Edington and Mr. Smith that this request be granted, and that all cadets, including high school students, be given permission to take part in this inspection.

The matter of transportation for school children was discussed and it was decided to take this up again at the next regular meeting.

Principal Mr. Brealey's request regarding scarifying of playground. Pauline Johnson School, was discussed, and it was resolved on motion of Trustees Mr. Smith and Mr. Edington that this matter be left in the hands of the Grounds Committee, with power to act.

MEMORIAL SHIELD FOR THE LATE JAMES M. MORGAN

The West Vancouver Choral Society have completed arrangements with the B. C. Musical Festival Committee to present a shield in memory of their late conductor Mr. James M. Morgan to whose untiring and capable efforts the Society owes much of its reputation.

It will be known as the James M. Morgan Memorial Shield and will be competed for annually by choirs which have not entered the Festival in any previous year.

The shield is on display for a few days in the window of Grigor's Store near 14th Street on Marine Drive. It is a particularly handsome trophy of a design peculiarly fitted for the purpose for which it is intended.
