Mrs. Lawson

"Queen-elect Peggy and citizens of our new May Day Empire, we welcome you on this the establishment of our Realm. We know you will always be stalwart supporters of the May Queen Throne and ardent workers for the happiness and welfare of all our juvenile subjects.

We now crown Peggy Barker chosen of our people, Queen of the May. We extend to your Royal Highness and to all your loyal subjects our sincere wishes for your happiness and prosperity."

(Addressing Mrs. Lawson)
"I accept this token of sovereignty from your hands and I feel indeed honored to be the first May Queen of West Vancouver when you, the oldest lady pioneer of this wonderful District, has so graciously placed this symbol of authority on my brow."

(Turning full to the audience)

"Friends both young and old, we thank you. We are indeed honored to be the Royal Party on this occasion: we are sure that this day, the first "All West Vancouver May Day Festival," will be a great success: and we know that joy and goodwill will be the real rulers in the hearts of all who are so happily gathered here. May our reign be the first of many joyous and carefree gala days for West Vancouver the Beautiful.

"My first and very pleasing duty is to present prizes to the Mothers of the babies who were successful in the Baby Contest held on Saturday. Immediately following, some of my youthful subjects will entertain us with an exhibition of Maypole and Folk Dancing, to be immediately followed by Sports in which all may take part.

"I, your first May Queen, ask that all of you enter wholeheartedly into the Day's rejoicing and make it a memorable day in the annals of West Vancouver."
