Chicken Salad

1 qt. cold boiled chicken, cut in small cubes
1 pt. finely cut celery
1 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper
2 hard-boiled eggs
2 cups mayonnaise dressing
6 olives.

Mix chicken which should be very tender, with celery, seasoning and one egg cut into small pieces; marinate with a little French Dressing, and let stand in cold place one hour. Serve on lettuce leaves and spread mayonnaise over top. Garnish with olives and remaining egg cut into slices. Dust with paprika.

Strawberry Mousse

1 box strawberries
1 cup sugar
1/4 box or 1 tablespoon granulated gelatine
2 tablespoons cold water
3 tablespoons boiling water
1 quart cream

Wash and hull berries, sprinkle with sugar and let stand one hour; mash and put through fine sieve; add gelatine which has been soaked in cold water and dissolved in boiling water. Set in pan of ice water and stir until it begins to thicken; fold in whipped cream. Put into mold, cover, pack in salt and ice, 1 part salt, 3 part ice; allow to stand 4 hours. Raspberries or peaches or shredded pineapple may be used instead of strawberries.

It was decided that the Municipal Council shall call a meeting of all Societies and representative citizens at an early date next year in order to continue the celebration on as successful an order as that just completed.

To take charge of the May Queen's visits, Mrs. W. B. Small and the Secretary, James P. Mitchell were given authority to make arrangements. Queen Peggy Barker and her maids of honor, Jean Hill and May Armstrong were present at the Caledonian Games at Hastings Park on Dominion Day to represent West Vancouver.

Reeve J. B. Leyland on behalf of the citizens thanked the members of the Committee for the zeal with which they had carried out the program for 1931. It was requested that expressions of gratitude be tendered through the press to the many citizens who gave so freely of their services in connection with the various functions sponsored on May Day.
