COUNCIL NOTES

Miss McCallum and George Bell were present at the council meeting regarding the former's application for access to and water service for Block "F", D.L. 582. Miss McCallum stated that she was prepared to pay for the opening up of a road to her property and had already obtained a tender for the work. If she could be assured of water service she would proceed with the opening of the road at once.

It was decided that so long as she provided access to her own property the council would provide water service on the usual percentage basis.

T. K. Lightly, inspector of fisheries, attended the council meeting re the stocking of Eagle Lake with trout. After discussion he was informed that the council would prefer not to grant his request because to do so might be detrimental to the watershed.

Lennox and Fletcher wrote the council regarding the ski camp lease at Hollyburn Ridge. They were advised that, before going into the question of the renewal of the lease the council would be glad to receive the last annual statement of the affairs of their clients and also to have an archiclients and also to have an archi-tect's plan of the building they proposed to erect.

Mrs. D. Thomas asked the council that brushing be done at 7th Street. She was informed that the council did not expect to have workmen working in that vicinity for some considerable time yet, but, should the necessity arise for their being in the vicinity, her request would be kept in mind.

The reeve directed the attention of the members of the council to a civic thanksgiving service to be held in the United Church on Sunday 19th July, in connection with the Diamond Jubilee of the province of B.C.'s joining confederation and requested that all members, if possible, would attend.
