**COUNCIL NOTES**

F. B. Lawrence wrote the  
council, offering to purchase D.L.  
2365. He was advised that the  
property was not for sale.

The engineer reported to the  
council on:

1. Floats at Odium Bay, Dun-  
darave and Ambleside. Propo-  
sal to anchor at Eagle Harbor ap-  
proved.

2. Glenagles Ltd. Removal of  
rock D.L. 771, Block 1, Lot 8.  
The writer to be informed that  
the council are willing to under-  
take the work and to supply a  
compressor which will be re-  
quired on receipt of a cheque for  
\$137.50 to cover the cost.

3. Isabel L. Dolman. Appli-  
cation re ditch, 1564 Fulton  
Ave. Referred back to the engi-  
neer.

4. Cemetery sprinkling sys-  
tem — approximate cost of in-  
stallation \$2,101. Referred to  
the cemetery board for consid-  
eration.

The council purchased for  
sinking fund account through  
Dermid Miller & McDermid,  
West Vancouver 5½% bond  
1945, price 89.83 to yield 6.75.

The council ordered transfer-  
red the sum of \$1,500 from the  
Ferry Savings Account to the  
Corporation General Savings  
Account.

The council purchased for  
sinking fund account a number  
of West Vancouver bonds total-  
ing \$34,500 at prices running  
between 94.97 and 73 from Mc-  
Dermid, Miller & McDermid,  
Western City, H. P. Swan, Wood  
Gundy & Co., Ames & Co., and  
Pemberton & Son.

Mr. and Mrs. Barbour came  
before the council re subdivision  
of Lots 8 and 9, Block 33, D.L.  
555. Their request was referred  
to the town planning board of  
appeal.

P. T. Masterman was present  
at the council meeting in regard  
to the provision of plumbing in  
the club house at Irwin Park,  
the approximate cost of which  
was \$30. The council ordered  
the work carried out on the un-  
derstanding that the applicant  
would assume responsibility for  
the proper care of same.

**Night School Classsss**

The School Board is prepared to institute Night School  
Classes in any subject ordinarily taught in West Vancouver  
Schools, either vocational or academic, provided a sufficient  
number is interested in any one subject to justify carrying  
on a class. A minimum of ten is required to form a class  
in any subject, and all interested are asked to communicate  
in writing to the undersigned, stating subject desired, all such  
enquiries to be in by Monday, October 9th.

Fee for the term of six months will be \$10.00, payable  
\$5.00 upon enrollment, and the remainder within thirty days.

If the number enrolled in any one class is substantially  
in excess of ten it may be possible to reduce the fee for this  
subject.
